a) Petition, 1978 February 06, Residents Concerned About The Vehicular Traffic And "Short Cutters" In The Area Of 4th Street And Canada Way And Edmonds Street North To Mayfield Street. Spokesman - Dennis Alexander

MOVED BY ALDERMAN AST: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN DRUMMOND:

### CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

a) Mr. Dennis Alexander then addressed Council and presented a petition signed by 477 residents of the Lakeview Neighbourhood Area requesting installation of four-way stop signs at the intersections of Goodlad Street and Sixth Street, Elwell Street and Sixth Street, Rosewood Street and Sixth Street, and two way stop signs to stop traffic on Wedgewood Street at Sixth Street. The petitioners further requested that the Municipality's long range plan to cul-de-sac Mayfield Street at Canada Way be put forward for completion as soon as possible.

The following is the preamble to the petition received:

"We the undersigned residents in the Lakeview Neighbourhood Area, hereby petition Council to consider the proposal, diagramed above, to install 4-way stop signs at the intersections of Goodlad and 6th Street, Elwell and 6th Streets, and Rosewood and 6th Streets and 2-way stop signs to stop traffic on Wedgewood at 6th Street. In addition, we request that the Municipality's long-range plan to cul-de-sac Mayfield Street at Canada Way be put forward for completion as soon as possible. Our desire with this proposal is to increase the safety of these residential intersections.

We, as residents, have become increasingly concerned over the disregard by motorists using 6th Street for the cross-traffic flows and for their disregard of the residential nature of 6th Street itself. We feel that this "through street" attitude, stemming from the arterial nature of 6th Street east of Edmonds, must be curbed before a life is lost (a recent accident at Elwell and 6th Streets resulted in extensive property damage and serious personal injury, miraculously a fatality was not involved).

We are aware that this area was the subject of a Planning Department study in the fall of last year. At that time the Planners presented the attached proposal intended to correct our problems. We do not endorse this proposal. Their plan can serve only to submit the additional blocks on Rosewood, Elwell and 4th Streets to the same problems presently encountered on 6th Street. The plan also has the critical disadvantage of exposing a greater number of children, particularly on 4th Street at the park, as potential accident victims.

We appeal to you and your Council to consider our proposal favourably."

Mr. Alexander went on to say that the barricades suggested by the Planning Department would force residents of the area living north of Rosewood Street wishing to proceed to New Westminster to make a left turn off the intersecting streets onto Canada Way which would be an extremely dangerous manoever. Mr. Alexander was also of the opinion that the barricade proposed for the intersection of Rosewood Street and Sixth Street would create great inconvenience for the residents of the area in that it would seriously hinder the circulation of neighbourhood traffic in the immediate area. Mr. Alexander noted that the installation of stop signs as requested by the petitioners had proven very satisfactory in other jurisdictions such as the City of Vancouver and the City of Calgary and requested that Council comply with the wishes of the petitioners in this respect.

The complaints are duly noted but no effective action has taken place.

Council was advised that a staff report on this subject would be available for consideration on 1978 February 20 and further consideration of the matter was deferred until that time.

d) Federation Of Canadian Municipalities, Executive Director, RE: Resolutions To Be Considered At The 1978 Annual Conference - Deadline Monday, 1978 March 20

A letter dated 1978 February 01 was received inviting submission of resolutions for consideration at the 1978 Federation of Canadian Municipalities annual conference. This year's conference will be held in Edmonton at the Edmonton Plaza Hotel from June 05 to June 08. Constituency Association urged Council to resolutely maintain Burnaby's right to deal with the 158 acres in the spirit in which they were dedicated. These lands were to be transferred from the Provincial Government for use by the Citizens of Burnaby. There is no question that the right to undisputed use of this land was intended when the memorandum was signed in 1975 by representatives of the Government and the District.

The Association urged Council to obtain the completion of the transfer by judicial intervention should the present government refuse to honor the executory agreement of 1975. It is surely a derogation of Burnaby's independence and the terms of the agreement reached in 1975 that a prolonged intervention by a provincial committee has been tolerated.
