The Municipal Finance Officers Association is presenting a two day seminar on Zero-Base Budgeting in Local Government. The seminar will be held in Los Angeles on 1978 March 6 and 7.

In 1977 October, I attended a similar seminar in Winnipeg, also put on by the M.F.O.A. The seminar is in fact a workshop that provides simulated "Hands-on" experience. Zero-base budgeting is an exciting concept in budgeting. It forces people to think. It causes management to have a better understanding of the corporation they control.

In order to develop the concept and assist in getting it started in Burnaby, at least on a pilot basis, I consider that it would be very useful to have the Deputy Treasurer and the Comptroller of Budgets attend the seminar in Los Angeles.

The estimated cost of the seminar is \$520.00 per individual.



As in the private sector, an important area of management concern within the public sector lies in the planning, budgeting and accountability process established by the governmental unit. Traditional attitudes of maintaining the status quo or undertaking only what is politically popular have been abandoned as management concern has led to developments such as performance budgeting, program budgeting and program planning. One relatively new approach gaining interest in the public sector is zero-base budgeting or ZBB.

With the rapid growth of expendi-

tures in recent years, governments at

In part, the growing interest in the ZBB process has been stimulated by President Carter. However, the budget-management advantages of ZBB are attracting, by their own merits, the recognition of an increasing number of state and local government managers. Zero-base budgeting derives its name from its perspective of the budgeting process—rather than using the previous year's budget as a base, ZBB assumes no base. All activities, old and new, must be examined and justified accordingly.


