Re: LETTER FROM MR. WILLIAM O. TOOMBS  
4343 CAMBRIDGE STREET, BURNABY  
FLYING THE CANADIAN FLAG

Appearing on the agenda for the 1978 June 19 meeting of Council is a request from Mr. William O. Toombs for the Canadian flag to be flown, particularly during Canada Week.

The Canadian and Provincial flags are flown from three locations adjacent to the Municipal Hall complex: the main entrance to the Hall adjoining the courtyard, the Art Gallery and the corner at Canada Way and Gilpin Street. The Canadian flag is also flown at Confederation Park and the Burnaby Mountain Pavilion. The flag is not flown at any of the Fire Halls but the feasibility of having this done will be discussed with the Director - Fire Services upon his return from vacation.

The Chief Librarian is at this time considering the feasibility of having poles installed for the display of flags at the various library locations. With respect to Canada Week, the Library will be celebrating this occasion with a number of films and appropriate displays.

The Union Jack is flown at Heritage Village.

Because Mr. Toombs has sent a copy of his letter to the School Board, we will not include in this report comments relative to the practices that may or may not be in effect at school locations in our community.
