MINUTES

The Minutes of the Council Meeting held on 1978 March 13 came forward for adoption.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

a) Mr. S. Bonettemaker then addressed Council on the subject of the proposed subdivision of the property at 5820 Byrne Road and the construction of new lumber facilities on the property for use by Nikolai Millwork Industries Limited.

The following is the text of Mr. Bonettemaker's submission:

During a meeting held on Wednesday, March 1st, 1978, attended by Mr. Stenson, Mr. Nikolai and the writer, we discussed the details of the proposed development and were informed of a policy which precludes granting subdivision approvals unless the land is serviced with a sanitary sewer.

We acknowledge the Planning staff's duty to enforce rather than vary from, established policies and we are satisfied that they have given us total cooperation within their power. As suggested by the

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Planning staff, on March 1st, 1978 we submitted an application for the subdivision, which we understand will be followed by a Planner's report describing the proposed future service improvements and the rationale as to why our application should not be approved at this time.

The reason for having to subdivide as a requirement for an ongoing industrial expansion program, is to permit the sale of approximately five acres upon which another developer has agreed to construct kilns and dry-sheds, and then lease the facilities back to Nikolai Millwork Industries. Although our client would prefer to be able to develop these facilities himself, recent additions and modernization of the existing plant and office have necessitated major capital investments to such an extent that these proposed facilities can now only be realized through the lease-back arrangement.

We understand that a planned subdivision of the adjoining Meadowland Peat property will eventually provide those services that will qualify our client's property for subdivision approval. However, there exists an urgent need for developing the kilns and dry-sheds at this time. By coincidence, these facilities are not dependent upon sanitary drainage, as there will be no industrial waste Whatsoever, and suitable staff washroom facilities already exist within a 70 ft distance.

Our client has recently established a significant export market for his locally grown and finished wood products, which will be lost without adequate manufacturing facilities, hence our urgent mequest for assistance.

On the assumption that the present policies will allow a subdivision at some future time, we request that Council consider an interim arrangement whereby:

- a) our client is granted a conditional approval for subdivision.
- b) the Municipality's interest is protected by performance deposits, restricted registerable covenants or other suitable forms of undertaking as recommended by Municipal Solicitors.'

MOVED BY ALDERMAN AST: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN DRUMMOND:

"THAT Item 16, Municipal Manager's Report No. 22, 1978 March 20 pertaining to this subject be brought forward for consideration at this time."

*The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Director of Planning concerning the proposed subdivision of the Nikolai Millwork Industries Limited property at 5820 Byrne Road (Subdivision Reference No. 24/78)

The Director of Planning noted that Mr. Bonettemaker had suggested that Council consider entering into an interim agreement whereby:

- a) his client is granted a conditional approval for subdivision.
- b) the Municipality's interest is protected by performance deposits, restricted registerable covenants or other suitable forms of undertaking as recommended by Municipal Solicitors.

This alternative is not viable as it clearly contravenes the Subdivision Control By-law. It is not possible to exempt a particular property as we need to maintain a consistent set of standards which are universally applied and not administered on an ad hoc basis. In the subject case, while the proposed use may not place a heavy demand on the sanitary sewerage facilities, it is conceivable that the use could change or the parcel be sold once subdivided. If indeed a subdivision was permitted which contravened the subdivision control by-law, a precedent would be set and the by-law effectively weakened.

At the present time, the Approving Officer is in receipt of a subdivision application which will be processed and a letter of tentative approval or disapproval granted accordingly.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

 THAT a copy of this report be sent to Mr. S. Bonnettemaker of Gower, Yeung and Associates Ltd.

"THAT the recommendation of the Municipal Manager be adopted and that the Planning Department continue to work with the applicant for this particular subdivision in an attempt to arrive at a fair and equitable solution to the problem of providing sewer facilities to this site."

b) Mr. Svend J. Robinson then addressed Council on the subject of providing covered bus shelters to serve residents of the Swedish Canadian Home and Manor. Mr. Robinson advised that he was representing approximately 160 residents of the Swedish Canadian Home and Manor, 25 of whom are in attendance at the Council meeting this evening and requested that Council take immediate action to have a covered bus shelter installed at Halifax Street and Duthie Avenue for the use of the residents of the Swedish Canadian Home and Manor.

Mr. Robinson noted that Council in 1976 had provided \$ 25,000. in the budget for the construction of bus shelters. To the best of his knowledge only one bus shelter had been built under that program. As a result of a proposal received from private companies to provide bus shelters in the Municipality in return for free advertising on these shelters, the Municipal Engineer had held in abeyance the construction of further bus shelters by the Municipality. Council subsequently accepted a recommendation from the Transit Committee that a proposal call be issued for the construction of bus shelters in the Municipality by private companies. To date, however, this proposal call has not been issued and Mr. Robinson was of the opinion that Council should proceed with the construction of a bus shelter at Halifax Street and Duthie Avenue utilizing the funds previously set aside for this purpose.

Mr. D.G. Stenson, Assistant Director - Current Planning advised that the issuance of the proposal call for providing bus shelters by private companies had been delayed due to the necessity of preparing amendments to the Burnaby Sign By-law which would allow advertising on bus shelters. The proposal call has now been finally drafted and it is anticipated that it will be issued in the very near future.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN GUNN: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN DRUMMOND:

"THAT Item 14, Municipal Manager's Report No. 22, 1978, March 20 pertaining to this subject be brought forward for consideration at this time."

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Municipal Engineer concerning Mr. Robinson's request for a bus shelter at Halifax Street and Duthie Avenue.

The Municipal Engineer advised that the Planning Department in the recent letter to Mr. Robinson dated 1978 February 27 advised him that the recommendations of the Transit Committee to accept the offer of private placement of bus shelters in return for advertisement priviledges had been accepted by Council and that a proposal call was being prepared for acceptable submissions. Once we have a program established for the placement of bus shelters favourable consideration will be given to senior citizens developments as top priority locations.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

 a) Union Of British Columbia Municipalities, Executive Director, RE: B.C. Council Of Public Sector, Employers

A letter dated 1978 March 03 was received advising of the recent establishment of the British Columbia Council Of Public Sector Employers. This organization has been formed at the initiation of the Provincial Government to coordinate public sector compensation in British Columbia through exchange of information among public sector employers and to maintain an relationship with pay in the private sector.

The members of the Council are expected to be the Provincial Government, Crown Corporations, Grown Agencies, Universities, Colleges, Schools, Health and Municipal Organizations.

The Union Of British Columbia Municipalities had been kept informed of the development of the Council since its beginning and has been requested to join in the activities of the Council.

The Union of British Columbia Municipalities Executive has determined that the Union of British Columbia Municipalities will not apply for full membership in the Council to represent all Union of British Columbia Municipalities members but that each Municipality or Regional District either individually or in groups as appropriate, should decide whether they wish to join the Council and make application directly for that purpose.

b) Union of British Columbia Municipalities, Executive Director, RE: Municipal And Regional District By-laws

A letter dated 1978 March 03 was received advising that the Executive of the Union of British Columbia Municipalities urges, in the strongest

terms possible, that Municipalities and Regional Districts undertake a review of all their by-laws to ensure:

- a) they are not outdated.
- b) they are still necessary.

One other matter to be considered when reviewing Municipal by-laws is the potential liability of a Municipality keeping in mind the recent recommended changes to the liability aspects contained in the report of the Law Reform Commission on Tort Liability of Public Bodies (we are not aware whether the proposals of the Law Reform Commission will be acted upon by the Province, but we do recommend that in the review of Municipal by-laws these recommended changes be kept in mind).

c) British Columbia Police Commission, Chairman, RE: Information on 1977 Crime Rates And Changes In Crime Statistics For All Municipalities With Their Own Police Departments Or Royal Canadian Mounted Police Contracts.

A letter dated 1978 March 06 was received enclosing information on 1977 Crime Rates and Changes in Crime Statistics for all Municipalities with their own police departments or Royal Canadian Mounted Police contracts. These communities are listed in order of population, using Statistics Canada 1976 Census status.

The 'crime rate' refers to the common calculation relating the number of crimes to the population. In this case, we use the total number of criminal code offenses (excluding traffic) per thousand people.

d) Union of British Columbia Municipalities, Executive Director, RE: Regional District Review Committee

A letter dated 1978 March 01 was received advising that the Executive of the Union of British Columbia Municipalities had considered the matter of presenting a brief to the Regional District Review Committee. Acknowledging the fact that many municipalities and regional districts have already presented formal presentations to the Committee, the Executive felt that it would greatly assist in their deliberations if a questionnaire were to be circulated to all members soliciting the opinions of Councils and Boards to specific matters.

A copy of the questionnaire was attached to the letter received.

His Worship, Mayor Constable advised that at a recent meeting of the Executive Committee of the Greater Vancouver Regional District it had been suggested that this questionnaire be circulated to individual members of Council and to members of various municipal boards and commissions and that the questionnaire be completed by individual members of Council and the boards and commissions so as to provide a better cross section of opinion to the Union of British Columbia Municipalities.

It was agreed that the foregoing procedure would be followed.

e) Greater Vancouver Convention And Visitors Bureau, General Manager, RE: Our Request Be Reconsidered by Council And Hopefully It Will Be Agreed To Restore The Full \$20,000. Funding

A letter dated 1978 March 09 was received concerning the Bureau's request to The Corporation of the District of Burnaby for a 1978 Investment of \$ 20,000. The General Manager of the Greater Vancouver Convention and Visitors Bureau requested that the Bureau's request be reconsidered by Council and hopefully it will be agreed to restore the full \$ 20,000. funding.

This item will be considered later in this meeting as Item 8(a) under Reports.

f) Federation of Canadian Municipalities, Executive Director, RE: 41st Annual Conference, Edmonton, Alberta - 1978 June 04 to 07 (Sunday to Wednesday)

A letter dated 1978 March 08 was received enclosing registration and hotel reservation forms together with a preliminary program for the 41st Annual Conference of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities to be held in Edmonton on 1978 June 04 to 07.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN LAWSON: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN AST:

g) Union of British Columbia Municipalities, Executive Director, RE: Tort Liability of Public Bodies

A letter dated 1978 March 10 was received advising that the Executive of the Union of British Columbia Municipalities has recently examined the report of the Law Reform Commission on British Columbia respecting Tort Liability of Public Bodies and has expressed its strong objections to the report and recommendations in a letter to the Attorney General of British Columbia.

It was pointed out in the correspondence that three years ago the Union of British Columbia Municipalities expressed positive objections to Working Paper Number 11 of the Commission in a brief presented to the Commission's chairman Mr. Len Getts and noted that numerous municipalities and regional districts had also opposed it. Despite these efforts, the final report is not substantially changed from the Working Paper.

Union of British Columbia Municipalities President Mayor J.J. Volrich has requested an early meeting with the Attorney General to explain the Union of British Columbia Municipalities objections and to oppose action by the Provincial Government in implementing any of the reports proposals.

h) Burnaby Arts Council, President And Coordinator, RE: Loftus House -6110 Price Street

A letter dated 1978 March 14 was received advising that the Burnaby Arts Council wished to inform Council of its interest in Loftus House. The Burnaby Arts Council proposal for the use of Loftus

House is being prepared and will shortly be submitted.

i) Judge L.S. Eckardt, Commissioner, RE: Province Of British Columbia, Public Hearing Royal Commission On Electoral Reform, 1978

As the instructor for the program we have been fortunate in obtaining Dr. Vern Buck who has had extensive experience with both public and private organizations. Dr. Buck is currently on the staff of the Banff Centre teaching communications for their programs including

those in Municipal Management and Executive Development.

The cost of the two seminars is estimated at approximately \$4,000. which would include two lunches for each participant, reproduction of course materials, miscellaneous expenses and Dr. Buck's fees which are \$570.00 per day. Participants from other municipalities would reimburse Burnaby on a cost basis except those from Vancouver which is providing its facility free of charge. These funds are provided for in the 1978 Annual Budget.

The Municipal Manager recommended:
