The Parks and Recreation Commission, at its meeting of 1978 May 17, received the following report on the above subject and granted permission to the Assistant Supervisor-Fine Arts to attend the Conference:

"Permission is requested for the Department to send Mr. Phillip Aird, Assistant Supervisor-Fine Arts, to the Dance and the Child Conference in Edmonton, 1978 July 25-27. The estimated cost is \$357 and funds are available in the Parks and Recreation Department's Conference Budget.

The Dance program offered by the Fine Arts Division has proven to be a very successful and popular portion of the Fine Arts programming and it is staff's intention to expand it further in the next year, with particular emphasis on children's classes. The two new studios at the Arts Centre being created from the Main Hall renovation, plus the potential use of the Eastburn Recreation Centre by the fall of 1979, will provide suitable facilities for program expansion.

Attached is the program schedule for the conference and it will be noted that the conference is composed of primarily working sessions, many of which the Supervisor-Fine Arts feels would be particularly valuable to Phillip Aird in future program planning, e.g. "Dance in the Arts Curriculum"; "Eurythmics - the Study of Music through Movement"; "Creative Dance Activity in Children through Experience in the Other Arts"; and "The Child as Spectator, Creator, Performer".

As this conference will prove a valuable learning experience for Phillip Aird and the knowledge gained will be beneficial in future program planning for the Fine Arts Division, it is recommended that the Commission approve the expenditure of \$357 for this conference.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT Council approve the attendance of the Assistant Supervisor-Fine Arts at the "Dance and the Child" Conference in Edmonton, Alberta, 1978 July 25-27 at an estimated cost of \$357.00.
