

RE: BY-LAW NO. 7019 - "BURNABY CENTRAL PARK PARKING

A report which Council received on 1978 September 18 referred to parking problems which exist in areas adjacent to the B. C. Telephone Company at Boundary and Kingsway. The matter was referred back to staff for a review on:

1. The parking situation in Central Park and the use of parking facilities in the park by employees and customers of the telephone company and the possible conflict such parking might create with regular patrons and
2. The use of parking meters as a means of controlling parking violations in the park.

As noted in the attached report from the Parks and Recreation Administrator, complaints are being received about the parking situation at Central Park, and because of the seriousness of this situation, the Commission proposes that a parking by-law be implemented as soon as possible.

Staff's report containing information on Council's request for a further review will be submitted in about three or four weeks. It would be appropriate for Council to enact a parking by-law as outlined in Item 9, Report No. 64 which Council received on September 18 before this further report is submitted should Council so desire.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. THAT the By-Law be brought forward;
2. THAT the British Columbia Telephone Company be notified when the By-law has been adopted; and
3. THAT a copy of this report be sent to the Parks and Recreation Commission.

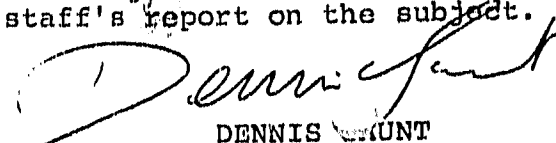
1. THAT Council implement the parking by-law for Central Park rather than waiting for the Director of Planning's report regarding the parking situation at the park.

REPORT

Council, at its meeting of 1978 September 18, received Item 9, Municipal Manager's Report No:64, concerning By-Law No: 7019 - "Burnaby Central Park Parking Regulation By-Law" and the Commission was advised at its 1978 October 04 meeting that this report was referred, by Council, back to staff for a comprehensive review of the parking situation concerning B. C. Telephone.

Arising out of the "Enquiries" portion of the 1978 October 18 meeting of the Parks and Recreation Commission, was a discussion on the parking situation at Central Park. Concern was indicated that the parking lot is full everyday of assumed B.C. Telephone Company employees and visitors, and park users are unable to find parking spaces. Numerous phone calls have been received by both Commission members and staff complaining about the parking situation.

The Commission members indicated that because of the serious situation, the matter should again be brought forward for Council's attention rather than waiting for staff's report on the subject.
