1. THAT By-Law No. 7209, being "Burnaby Expropriation By-Law No. 3, 1978" be introduced and given three readings.



By-Law No. 7173, being the "Burnaby Expropriation By-Law No. 2, 1978", authorized the expropriation of Lot 1, Block 23, D.L. 6, Group 1, Plan 6991, New Westminster District. This property is registered in the name of The Director, The Veterans' Land Act and may be expropriated by Council only with the consent of the Governor in Council and subject to any terms that may be prescribed by the Governor in Council. It was intended that this by-law receive three readings and be adopted after the consent of the Governor in Council was obtained. This procedure was not followed. The by-law was adopted and the consent has not yet been obtained. The solicitor for the occupier of the property has stated that the by-law is invalid since it was adopted without the consent of the Governor in Council. Certainly the by-law is not effective until that consent has been obtained. As an abundance of caution, it is recommended that a new expropriation by-law receive three readings and be adopted only after the consent has been obtained. The new by-law will at the same time repeal By-Law No. 7173.

RECOMMENDATION:

That By-Law No. 7209, being "Burnaby Expropriation By-Law No. 3, 1978" be introduced and given three readings.
