#### CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

a) Mr. Fred Clarke representing the Sullivan Heights Ratepayers' Association then addressed Council on the subject of the proposed revisions to a sub-area between Cameron Street and Sullivan Street in Community Plan Area "G". Mr. Clarke advised that the members of the Sullivan Heights Ratepayers' Association took objection to the recommendations contained in Item 27, Municipal Manager's Report No. 44, 1978 June 12. The Sullivan Heights Ratepayers' Association does not feel that its position was properly indicated in Schedule 1- General Estimated Value page 198. This study shows the Association indicating a neutral or equivocal trend to Alternative 3(a) Sketch 8(a). The Association is on record as opposing this alternative completely and only after presentation to the Advisory Planning Commission has the Association consented to Alternative 2(a) Sketch 7(a).

The following is a list of objections to Council's approval of Alternative 3(a), Sketch 8(a) for use as a guideline for the completion of Community Plan "G" for the sub-area between Sullivan and Cameron Streets:

- The General Estimated Value Study page 198 shows the Sullivan Heights Ratepayers' Association as being neutral to Alternative 3(a) Sketch 8(a), whereas the Association is on record as being opposed to this plan.
- 2. The Association's position as of March 29, 1977 showing a plan with Beaverbrook extending up the middle of the area, turning at the proposed Reece Avenue and connect to Cameron Street, is linked to Alternative 3(a) Sketch 8(a) as being similar, nothing could be further from the truth. The Association's opinion at that time was a compromise for the residents of Sullivan Street if the Beaverbrook extension had to go through.
- 3. The Association also objected to the omission of their presentation to the Advisory Planning Commission on 1978 April 17 from the Manager's Report.
- 4. The Association would like to reemphasize their position that no housing development of any kind be planned for this area and that it supports the Park and Recreational Development as their "Number One" objective regarding the future use of this land.

Mr. Clarke reiterated the Sullivan Heights Ratepayers' Association preference for the development of this area as a Parks and Recreation complex.

Mr. John Friesen speaking on behalf of the Buckingham Area Residents then addressed Council on the subject of the volume and speed of traffic on Buckingham Avenue, Sperling Avenue and surrounding streets. The following is the text of Mr. Friesen's submission:

"This report is submitted to you for your consideration on behalf of the residents of the area known as the 'Deer Lake Area' bounded by Canada Way, Sperling, Buckingham and Burris.

You are no doubt aware of the concerns expressed by both individuals and groups over the past 10 years at various public meetings, the most recent of which was held in the Council Chambers on February 23, 1978. To this point, no visible action has been taken by the Municipality to remedy the problems.

The problem has been further exemplified by the following events in the last several months:

- an accident resulting in two fatalities on Buckingham Avenue.
- a boy run down on the sidewalk while walking home from school. He suffered two broken legs.
- an accident resulting in serious injuries to five young occupants of a car which was drag racing on Buckingham Avenue.
- a five year old boy hospitalized with serious injuries after being hit be a car on Sperling Avenue.
- numerous complaints of drag racing, speeding, damage to lawns and landscaping, noise from motorcycles and 'muscle car' engines.

The most recent events resulted in the residents of the area organizing a further meeting on June 27th, 1978 to discuss traffic problems in the area and the means available to prompt action from Council in this matter. This meeting was attended by over 70 residents of the area.

It was generally recognized at this meeting that three basic problems exist with the traffic in the area:

- 1. Large volumes of commuter traffic using Sperling and Buckingham as a 'short cut'. The peak periods for this traffic coincide with the times that school children are going to and coming home from school.
- 2. Large volumes of traffic resulting from the existence of Deer Lake Park.
- 3. Excessive speeds on Sperling and Buckingham, from both commuter traffic and Deer Lake traffic.

It is the two problems of the commuter traffic and the speeding that the residents wish Council to deal with. It was recognized that the problem could perhaps best be dealt with on the following basis:

- a) Solutions which will reduce speed of local residents, lake traffic and commuter traffic. The following measures could be implemented quickly and inexpensively and would greatly reduce the traffic speed 'in the area:
  - 1. That three-way stop signs and flashing stop lights be installed at the intersection of Buckingham and Sperling.
  - 2. That four-way stop signs and flashing stop lights be installed at the intersection of Buckingham & Haszard.

3. That the speed limit on lower Buckingham and Sperling be reduced.

. That speed bumps be installed on Sperling particularly in front of Deer Lake Park and also on Buckingham.

These recommendations were unanimously accepted by the 70 residents attending the June 27th meeting. The entire neighbourhood was subsequently canvassed and as members of Council can see, unanimous consent to these recommendations was given.

b) A permanent solution to the problem of commuters using Sperling and Buckingham as a by-pass. Proposal as follows:

That a blockade gate be installed on Sperling and Canada Way and a blockade also be installed on Chiselhampton and Canada Way, Haszard and Canada Way and Rugby and Canada Way. The gate on Sperling and Canada Way to be constructed in such a way that it can be opened by either the Fire Department or Police and that it could be left open during the snowy weather.

The above recommendation was also circulated in the neighbourhood and it too received virtually unanimous support. The few people that had reservations concerning the proposal, said that they would go along with the wishes of the majority, even though they would not sign the petition.

Further to these recommendations, we offer one more suggestion which will also help solve the problem:

A reasonable curfew at Deer Lake Park, as much of the annoyance is noise of tire squeeling, motors reving, racing, speeding and drunken partying after midnight.

As members of Council are aware, this area of Deer Lake is a unique area in which the residents take great pride in maintaining a beautifully landcaped and groomed neighbourhood, resembling a park. We wish to preserve this quality of our neighbourhood and maintain an area of which Burnaby can be very proud. The extra traffic which this residential area must cope with, amounts to approximately 4,000 vehicles per day. It must therefore be obvious to members of Council that this volume of traffic and the speed with which some of it travels, is an unacceptable burden to be placed on any residential area.

However, our greatest area of concern as a community, is for the safety of the local children. Buckingham Avenue and Sperling Avenue are the main routes taken by all the children of the area in going to and from school and playgrounds. Buckingham Avenue has one blind 'dog leg' corner and two blind hills, as well as a shroud of trees and shrubs along its entire length. These large numbers of speeding cars simply cannot see children in their path and it is obvious, that it is only a matter of time before more tragedies occur.

This problem which is steadily worsening, demands immediate attention. We thank you for your anticipated solution."

- 5. That the Urban Transit Authority Act be restructured so that Regional Transit Commissions are given more effective and genuine decision-making authority in local transit decisions.
- 6. That meetings of the Authority Board and Regional Transit Commissions be held in public and that the minutes, after every meeting, be available to the public.
- 7. That the District of Burnaby Municipal Council request that the Greater Vancouver Regional District contact the Federal Minister of Transport, the Honourable O.E. Lang, to discuss the allocation of the 230 Million Dollars appropriated for Urban Transit in major Canadian Cities.
- 8. That a copy of this report item be forwarded to the Greater Vancouver Regional District for distribution to other Municipalities in the Lower Mainland area and to the 3 Burnaby Members of the Legislative Assembly. "


