A series of tours around local points of interest related to the conference theme are being organized. Don't be surprised if what you see is more than what you might expect in "cowtown". Among other things we will be visiting Gulf Canada Square, a 2-million sq. ft. multi-use complex billed as the world's most energy efficient building and under construction only two blocks away from the conference centre.
