REPORT

Appearing on Council's agenda for the meeting of 1979 December 10 is a letter from the International Society for Krishna Consciousness of Vancouver. They are seeking Council's approval to set up stands at various commercial locations to display and accept donations for handicraft items produced by members of this organization.

The Burnaby Street and Traffic By-law No. 4299 provides that written permission of Council shall be obtained when an organization is seeking donations upon any street in the Municipality. In this case it is proposed that the soliciting will take place on private property, therefore, Council's approval is not required.

Soliciting for funds by registered charitable organizations does not constitute the operation of a business, therefore no licence is required.

Notwithstanding, the undertaking that is proposed will be expected to meet the normal standards of the Municipality's by-laws with respect to the districts in which the premises are located. To this end, the Chief Licence Inspector will contact the organization to advise of the pertinent requirements.




