

Further to an enquiry by Council, we would advise that the above-noted property was inspected by this Department. The concerned premises were found to be in contravention of the "Burnaby Unsightly Premises By-law No. 5533" and as such, a Return Registered letter was forwarded to the assessed owner, Imperial Oil Limited, requesting that the premises be brought into compliance with the said By-law.

We would advise that an inspection of 1979 February 28 revealed that the tires had been removed and the timbers preventing entry to the property had been anchored.
