a) Mr. L.B. Roitman, half owner and Manager, Admiral Hotel (1977) Limited then read a prepared brief on the subject of extending the operating hours of the Class "A" Pub Licence at the Admiral Hotel from 23:00 h to 01:00 h.

Mr. Roitman requested that Council give earnest consideration to this request for an extension of operating hours for the "Pub" portion of the premises. Mr. Roitman was of the opinion that this extension of operating hours would go far in eliminating some of the problems that are presently being encountered at the present time whereby the "Pub" portion of the establishment is required to close at 23:00 h while the balance of the establishment remains open to 01:00 h.

Mr. Roitman further pointed out that the additional security arrangements that had been made to eliminate to a large extent the complaints of excessive noise and rowdyism in the hotel and the adjacent parking lots.

b) Mr. K.S. Shearman, Chairman, Burnaby Heights Concerned Citizens Committee, then addressed Council concerning the excessive use of residential streets in the northwest Burnaby area.

Mr. Shearman presented a petition signed by 870 residents of the area bounded by Boundary Road, Willingdon Avenue, Albert Street and Burrard Inlet. The following is the preamble to that petition:

"WHEREAS present traffic counts in the area bounded by Albert, Willingdon, Boundary Road and Burrard Inlet show that the streets are at present carrying traffic far in excess of that for which they were designed;

WHEREAS this excess through traffic is a direct result of the incompleted section of the Freeway and 2nd Narrows Bridge;

WHEREAS construction of an off-ramp at Cambridge will serve only to increase through traffic in this area;

WE, the undersigned residents of Dundas Street PETITION Municipal Council of Burnaby to take the following actions forthwith 1 - To stop all through traffic from using the residential streets in the aforementioned area;

- 2 To bring pressure to bear on the Provincial Department of Highways and the G.V.R.D. to solve the through traffic problems by completing the Freeway connection;
- 3 To oppose construction of an off-ramp at Cassiar and Cambridge;
 4 To press for an immediate start on Rapid Transit along the Burrard south shore."

Mr. Shearman pointed out that this petition represents 97 percent of the people living in this particular area.

Mr. Shearman requested Council to take action immediately to eliminate through traffic from the streets in question before the City of Vancouver aggravates the problem with the construction of a Freeway off-ramp at Cambridge Street which will deliver 12,000 cars a day to the boundary of our municipality right on the edge of the community in which the petitioners live.

The petitioners strongly support the policy statement of the Burnaby Transportation Committee which calls for a policy to maintain the integrity, liveability and general environment of residential neighbourhoods. The Transportation Committee also urges Council to pursue a policy of development of a Comprehensive Public Transportation system. This the petitioners want also.

The petitioners wish to go on record supporting the recommendations of the Burnaby Transportation Committee. They expect to be kept informed of all public meetings where transportation is discussed so that they can make their demands known before action detrimental to their community is taken.

c) Miss Leslie Pavich then addressed Council on the subject of the 1979 "Miss Burnaby" Campaign.

Miss Pavich noted that she had been "Miss Burnaby" in 1978. Miss Pavich noted that she was here this evening representing a group called "Community Promotions". The group is made up of herself and four past Presidents of the Burnaby Junior Chamber of Commerce. The groups objective was to convey to Council the importance of the continuation of the representation of Burnaby by a "Miss Burnaby". At this time, there is no support for a "Miss Burnaby" and her group would like to take on this task. In the past several years Burnaby has been active in its support of other municipalities' activities and functions such as Sea Festival Parade, the Nanaimo Bathtub race and other such functions. Miss Pavich considered that "Miss Burnaby" played a vital role in the promotion of the Municipality and that there had been a "Miss Burnaby" for the last 30 years. In 1978, the "Miss Burnaby" function was handled by the Burnaby Chamber of Commerce but that was on a one year basis only. Miss Pavich noted that "Community Promotions" budget for the 1979 "Miss Burnaby" Pageant had been submitted and she requested that Council give consideration to their request for assistance.

The "Miss Burnaby" Pageant cannot be held without Council's support.

Imperial Oil Limited is most anxious that these valuable properties be put to use as the residual value continues to exist without any return plus ongoing taxes.

Imperial Oil Limited has leased some properties and have had Comprehensive Development on others but requires the understanding of the Municipal Planning Department and Council in assisting in the development of these properties when applications for development are submitted by interested parties.

Rezoning is not easy to come by in Burnaby, however, if Burnaby desires these vacant service station sites developed, then they will have to co-operate in the reasonable development of the sites.

Imperial Oil Limited believes that Burnaby Council will recognize that their subsidiary "Devon Estates" is taking positive action to recognize the desires of the Municipal Planners but by the same token, Imperial Oil Limited solicit their co-operation in assisting when development plans are submitted for alternative uses of the properties.

Item 13, Municipal Manager's Report No. 38, 1979 May 14, pertaining to this subject, was brought forward for consideration at this time.

The following are the recommendations contained in this report:

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A letter dated 1979 April 30 was received enclosing two Province of British Columbia cheques totalling \$795,200.00, of which \$30,000.00 covers the basic grant under Part I of the Revenue Sharing Act Regulations, and \$765,200.00 accounts for the first of nine installments of the 1979 Unconditional Grant calculated under Part VIII. The remaining eight Unconditional Grant cheques will be issued at regular intervals throughout the balance of the year.

These cheques form part of the continuing distribution of benefits from the special fund established by the Revenue Sharing Act. Eventually, almost \$142,000,000.00 will be dispersed from the Revenue Sharing Fund during 1979.

c)

Re: Proposed Reconstruction Of Boundary Road From Imperial Street To Marine Way

The Transportation Committee noted that the Municipality has recently been notified by letter from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs that they have agreed to provide \$576,000.00 to the Municipality of Burnaby to pay for one-half of Burnaby's cost of acquiring the requisite right-of-way. Additionally, it is understood that the City of Vancouver, who applied in part on the Municipality's behalf for construction funding, has been granted \$200,000.00 by the Provincial Government to pay for 50 percent of the construction costs programmed for 1979.

At its meeting of 1979 May 03, the Transportation Committee gave consideration to a proposal that the Committee advance its specific consideration of the Boundary Road project in view of the Province's agreement to Revenue Share its development. The Committee, at that time, resolved that it would not be in the best interest of the Municipality to abandon its adopted work program schedule to deal with this road proposal in isolation. This position was based on the commitment given to the community at large to hold a series of Public Hearings concerned with the proposed overall Transportation Plan for the Municipality as is being developed by the Committee, and as well, the belief that this item can only be proceeded with in the context of an overall Transportation Plan adopted by the Municipal Council.

The Transportation Committee recommended:

1. THAT the Transportation Committee proceed with its adopted work program schedule, including Public Hearings, leading towards the early submission to Council of a recommended Transportation Plan for the Municipality that will address the Boundary Road issue as one component.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN EMMOTT: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN MERCIER:

"THAT Item 18, Municipal Manager's Report No. 38, 1979 May 14, pertaining to this subject, be brought forward for consideration at this time."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Director of Planning concerning Boundary Road from Imperial Street to Marine Way.

The Director of Planning reported that Planning Department Staff had met with Vancouver Staff on 1979 May 10 to discuss the conditions and timing constraints associated with the granting of the applicable Revenue Sharing Funds.

At the outset of the meeting, Vancouver Staff were apprised of the Transportation Plan Review Program being undertaken by the Burnaby Transportation Committee and its desire to proceed with the adopted work program schedule, including Public Hearings, on a conceptual Transportation Plan as prepared by the Committee. This program is leading to the early submission to Council of a recommended Transportation Plan for the Municipality that will address the Boundary Road issue as one component.

Vancouver Staff appreciated the position of the Transportation Committee in meeting its Public Hearing commitment but at the same time, expressed serious concern that delays in the initial phases of the project could jeopardize funds associated with those works not completed by the 1979 December 31 completion date which is stipulated in the Revenue Sharing Grant. The primary work associated with the 1979 portion of the construction program is clearing and rough grading associated with Boundary Road and portions of their Marine Way alignment. It is Vancouver's intention to use the substantial excess fill from the Boundary Road grading in the Marine Way construction as a cost saving measure. According to Vancouver staff, the clearing and grading phases of this project will take approximately 6 months with weather conditions beyond September being a major concern. This projected timing is the basis of their extreme sense of urgency in commencing the project and utilizing the Revenue Sharing Funds which have been allocated up to 1979 December 31.

It was agreed, after considerable discussion, that although the 1979 construction period would be shortened, it would be reasonably workable if Burnaby's consideration of this phase in the construction program came no later than immediately after the scheduled Public Meeting concerning Boundary Road during the week of 1979 June 11. Accordingly, Vancouver will be requesting Burnaby's decision of this aspect of the proposed construction immediately following the Boundary Road Public Meeting.

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Municipal Treasurer concerning a request received to have Burnaby provide to the Real Estate Board of Greater Vancouver, certain non-confidential data stored on Municipal Property Tax Computer files. The City of Vancouver, by agreement with the Real Estate Board of Greater Vancouver presently provides similar information.

As requested by Council, the report also includes information on the processing of applications in terms of what can be done to reduce the amount of time that they remain in the system.

The Director of Planning reported that the time period involved in simple property consolidations is a matter of concern to staff. Total processing time is mainly determined by the technical examination/ comment/estimating function in connection with engineering services. While it would be difficult to justify, in fairness, assigning a higher priority to one subdivision application in preference to others already in process, it may be possible for the technical departments involved to expedite those simple, straight forward consolidations which require only nominal checking and processing, as distinguished from subdivision applications which will undoubtedly require layout and system design decisions, extensive estimating activity, etc.

In order to arrive at some means of speeding up the processing of such simple consolidations, the Planning Department will undertake to discuss with the other departments and agencies involved in subdivision approval the best way to expedite their handling. The objective will be to implement some procedure whereby straight forward consolidations for development purposes can be "fast tracked" to avoid delays while technical engineering matters in other more complex subdivisions are being processed. With specific reference to Newport Enterprise's application, the matter is well in hand and the Planning Department expects to receive technical information necessary for tentative approval very shortly.

The Municipal Manager reported that by consolidating former Lots 18 and 19 (now Lot 105), closing portions of the Antrim Avenue and lane allowances and by dedicating and constructing the east/west lane allowance, an improved industrial site has been created. The former owner of these lots had rejected the road exchange requirements for his development proposal and indicated that he would be receptive to the sale of Lots 18 and 19 and would make other arrangements for the accommodation of his business. 385

The properties were consequently purchased by the Municipality for a price of \$160,000.00 in December 1977. Through this property acquisition and site reconfiguration process, the Municipality has secured a superior building site for disposal and also obtained lane allowance necessary for the completion of the road system in this area; the estimated value of the lane allowance as secured is \$30,527.31.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

1. THAT the Municipal lot as described in this report be advertised in the Columbian, Express, Burnaby Times, and Boundary Road newspapers with the minimum bid as indicated and subject to the submission of a suitable plan of development.

15. Letter from Mr. John R. McIsaac which appeared on the Agenda for the 1979 May 07 meeting of Council Local Improvement Project on Georgia Street

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Municipal Engineer regarding a Local Improvement Project on Georgia Street.

The Municipal Engineer advised that with regard to the debris left after tree planting, the Parks and Recreation Department advises that the method of planting trees results in some debris being on the boulevard for a short period of time. The time sequence of planting trees is that the holes are dug, trees are planted, and then a large percentage of the hole soil is removed; some soil is left to allow for settlement and the excess is removed later. As a matter of policy, the boulevards on local improvement projects are dressed with top soil but not seeded. The homeowner is advised of this in a hand delivered information sheet prior to the beginning of construction.

Throughout the area, generally speaking, there are fire hydrants located at intersections but there are many instances in the area where hydrants are located within the blocks. In conjunction with the local improvement project on Georgia Street, as previously mentioned, there was also a watermain replacement. Prior to watermain replacement, there were two hydrants between Willingdon Avenue and Delta Avenue; with the watermain work, this spacing was upgraded to include four hydrants to provide improved fire protection for the area. The hydrants were spaced at approximately equal distances from each other and this of necessity results in hydrants being located within blocks. In actual practice, the hydrant would be located opposite an internal property line which is closest to the equal distance possible and if possible, not adjacent to their driveway. The subject hydrant is situated slightly offset from the extension of the property line because the property line position would have resulted in disruption to existing shrubbery, but there is no adjacent driveway.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

1. THAT Mr. John R. McIsaac, 4573 East Georgia Street, Burnaby, B.C., V5C 2V4, be sent a copy of this report.

19. U.B.C.M. Resolutions

The following is the text of the resolution in question:

"WHEREAS Section 714(k) of the Municipal Act permits an occupancy permit to be withheld until the building or part thereof complies with the health and safety requirements of Municipal By-laws or of any statute;

AND WHEREAS Section 714(f) of the Municipal Act prescribes conditions generally respecting the issuance and validity of permits and the inspection of works and things, buildings and structures;

AND WHEREAS private roads within a comprehensive development have not been construed as 'things' relative to Section 714(f);

AND WHEREAS roads play an important part in the safety of a comprehensive development;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government be requested to amend the Municipal Act to permit, as a condition for the issuance of occupancy permits, the satisfactory compliance with Municipal specifications for the construction of private roads in comprehensive developments."

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- 2. THAT this resolution be referred to the General Membership Meeting of the Lower Mainland Municipal Association for endorsation and submitted to the U.B.C.M.
