RE: LETTER FROM CANADIAN DIABETIC ASSOCIATION WHICH APPEARED ON THE AGENDA FOR THE 1979 FEBRUARY 19 MEETING OF COUNCIL (ITEM 3h) REQUEST TO CONDUCT A BIKE-A-THON.

Appearing on last week's agenda was a request from the Canadian Diabetic Association for approval to conduct a bike-a-thon in Burnaby on Sunday, 1979 May 06. Following is a report from the Municipal Engineer on this matter.

RECOMMENDATION:

- I. THAT Council grant permission to the Canadian Diabetic Association to conduct a Bike-a-thon on 79 05 06 along the route recommended by the Engineering Department and subject to the conditions set forth in this report, and furthermore subject to approval being obtained by the Association from the Provincial Department of Highways for that portion of the route that is within that Department's jurisdiction.

REPORT

This Department did not approve the proposed route of the captioned Bike-a-thon. As a result we met with a member of the Association and outlined a route which we felt is more desirable. This alternative route, shown on the attached sketch, is acceptable to the Association.

In discussing this route with the Association we recommended that they advise participants to exercise due caution at all times with particular attention to the section shown on the map located between two black triangles. This section is along minor residential streets with very few of the cross-streets controlled by stop or yield signs.

The recommended route is designed to utilize traffic signals when the crossing of an arterial street is required. Also, with the exception of Kingsway between Patterson and Boundary, this route avoids any major arterials which even on a Sunday could present hazardous cyclist/motorist conflicts.


The approval for staging this Bike-a-thon is subject to the following conditions:

1. Compliance with Section 23 of the Burnaby Streets and Traffic By-law (copy attached).
2. Participants to comply fully with all traffic control devices encountered en route.

3. Participants to travel in single file and not obstruct normal pedestrian and vehicular traffic. 139
4. Participants to be instructed at the outset to respect private property and the rights of individuals along the route.

The section of the recommended route which uses Kingsway is not the jurisdiction of the Municipality therefore the approval for this section will be required from the Ministry of Highways.

The R.C.M.P. were consulted on this report and concur with the contents.

SECTION 23 OF THE STREETS AND TRAFFIC BY-LAW

23. (1) No person shall be a member of, or take part in, any parade and no parade shall be held unless:
- (a) such parade be under the direction or control and in charge of some one person as marshal or organizer, and
 - (b) application therefore has been made in writing to the Council by the marshal or organizer or other person in charge thereof at least twenty-four hours before the parade commences and such application receives the approval of the Engineer and the Chief of Police. Such application shall specify the nature of the parade, the day and hour on or at which such parade is to be held, the place or places of formation or commencement thereof, the route intended to be taken, the point of disbandment or dispersal of same, and the approximate length thereof.
23. (2) The Engineer and Chief of Police in granting their approval may impose directions or conditions as to time, route or otherwise.
