

(b) Mrs. Margaret M. Taylor, 5649 Canada Way, Burnaby

Re: Hazardous traffic conditions on Canada Way

Mrs. Taylor then addressed the Traffic Safety Committee and advised that she has been a resident on Canada Way for the past twenty years and was here this evening representing her family and the other residents on Canada Way. Mrs. Taylor was of the opinion that the barricades placed in the Buckingham Heights area were unfair to the majority of residents living in the general area. She realizes that traffic volumes increase from year to year but feels that everyone should share this increase.

Mrs. Taylor advised that access and egress to her property from Canada Way is nearly impossible now during all hours of the day. She advised that previous to the installation of the barricades during the non rush hour periods it was possible, however, since the installation of the barricades a problem exists throughout the day.

Mrs. Taylor requested that the Committee pursue an alternative form of access and egress for her property.

Alderman Drummond then advised the delegation that the barricade situation in the area is being monitored and that there will be a staff report to the Committee in 1979 September.
