It is possible that the Dominion Bridge property could provide the administrative and operating base for a future L.R.T. system for the Lower Mainland. The land is on the current British Columbia Hydro and Power Authority railway right-of-way, has suitable improvements and is centrally located. The future assembly of an equivalent 50 acre parcel could prove very expensive.

In view of the inpending transfer of these assets to the Urban Transit Authority, it was requested that Council delay consideration of the application to subdivide.
