Mr. H.G. Hrynyk then addressed Council on behalf of the Burnaby Citizens' Roads Committee on the proposed development of Boundary Road. The following is the substance of Mr. Hrynyk's address:

Mr. Hrynyk noted that following the Public Meeting held on 1979 June 12 under the auspices of the Transportation Committee, a further meeting had been arranged between the Burnaby Citizens' Roads Committee and the Transportation Committee for June 20 to discuss the development of Boundary Road in greater detail.

Mr. Hrynyk noted that the Transportation Committee had no facts or figures available at this meeting and the meeting was not meaningful. Mr. Hrynyk questioned the necessity and the validity of considering the development of Boundary Road between Marine Way and Imperial Street ahead of the overall Conceptual Roads Plan which will be considered by Council on 1979 July 30. He was of the opinion that the same Provincial sharing of costs would still be available after that date. The Burnaby Citizens' Roads Committee was also of the opinion that Provincial Revenue Sharing Funds for the acquisition of lands in Burnaby should be used before the acquisition of light rapid transit facilities rather than for a road which would be located in Vancouver

Mr. Hrynyk further questioned the grades proposed for the portion of Boundary Road between Marine Way and Rumble Street. He stated that the Burnaby Citizens' Roads Committee did not agree with the figures quoted in the report of the Transportation Committee. He noted that the maximum grades between Marine Way to Marine Drive is 15 percent while the portion between Marine Drive and Rumble Street is 6 percent, rather than the 9.2 percent mentioned in the report of the Transportation Committee. Mr. Hrynyk advised that the Burnaby Citizens' Roads Committee does not agree with the necessity of a third lane northbound from Marine Way to Rumble Street.

Mr. Hrynyk urged Council to consider the development of Boundary Road as part of the whole Conceptual Roads Plan rather than as an isolated project as proposed by the Transportation Committee.

The Authority will now supply municipalities with a copy in the hope that it will prove beneficial to the Planning, Realty or other divisions when they have the need for realty sales information. The marginal cost of producing this information is negligible, but if it is of no use to the municipality, the Assessment Authority requested that they be so advised. Otherwise, each Spring, the Municipality will receive a copy of the sales which are recorded during the preceeding year. There are also quarterly supplements which can be sent upon request. As an introductory package the Authority was providing sales covering the period January 1976 to December 1977 and January 1978 to December 1978.

b) Banting Place Concerned Citizens,

 Re: Concerned Over The Proposed Transportation
 Plan For Boundary Road

A letter dated 1979 June 26 was received advising that the Banting Place Concerned Citizens were concerned over the proposed transportation plan for Boundary Road. They did not wish any widening of the current two uphill lanes to three uphill lanes. The lessened grade should allow truck traffic to maintain a reasonable speed up the hill and the "third lane" will only encourage unnecessary truck traffic. They were told at the Public Meeting on 1979 June 10 that there would be three lanes until Boundary Road passed through a residential area. Boundary Road is a residential area from below Marine Drive to Central Park and beyond. The Banting Place Concerned Citizens were also concerned with the question of adequate access to Banting Place including the safety of children going to Suncrest School. They were also concerned with the noise levels that may result from the development of Boundary Road as currently proposed.
