CORRESPONDENCE AND PETITIONS

(a) Canadian Association of Industrial Mechanical And Allied Workers, Local 12, Secretary-Treasurer, Re: We would recommend that the services of the R.C.M.P. be dispensed with and replaced by Municipal Police

A letter dated 1979 April 14 was received in which it was noted that recent events have raised the issue of R.C.M.P. involvement in labour disputes.

Canadian Association of Industrial Mechanical and Allied Workers recommended that the services of the R.C.M.P. be dispensed with and replaced with Municipal Police. It was considered that a Police Force would be much more responsible if it were based entirely in the community and if it were not burdened by the R.C.M.P.'s history of partisan involvement in labour disputes.

(b) Province of British Columbia, Ministry of Education, Science And Technology, Minister, Re: Education costs in British Columbia

A letter dated 1979 April 17 was received acknowledging receipt of Council's letter of March 15 wherein the Corporation of the District of Burnaby requested changes in the Schools Finance Fprmula.

The Minister pointed out that the basic levy is only 41 mills which will assist all school districts in British Columbia. In addition, the increase in the Home Owner Grant will also generate benefits to all taxpayers in the Province.

(c) Province of British Columbia, Ministry of Education, Science And Technology, Minister, Re: Financing Of Community Colleges

A letter dated 1979 April 17 was received acknowledging receipt of Council's letter of March 15 regarding funding of regional colleges.

The Minister pointed out that local taxpayers have now been relieved of any direct contribution toward college funding.

 d) Office of the Minister of Justice and Attorney / General of Canada, Special Adviser,
 Re: Restitutional And Reparative Sentencing

A letter dated 1979 April 17 was received concerning restitutional and reparative sentencing.

The letter advised that the Federal Government has introduced legislation in Bill C-21 that would enable Judges to dispose of cases through community service orders that could deal with restitution and reparation.

The Department of Justice is working with the Department of the Solicitor General to develop a workable concept of diversion which would involve programs that encourage direct restitution and reparation of property damage caused during the commission of alleged criminal offences. The Criminal Law Reform Fund at the Department of Justice is also sponsoring many projects that are dealing experimentally with restitution programs for direct compensation to vicitms of crime.

All of these initiatives will provide valuable information for policy planners in the departments who are developing Criminal Code amendments which it is hoped will respond to the concerns expressed by your Municipal Council.

Re: Complaint Re Housing Inspector's Authority

A letter dated 1979 April 17 was received concerning the inspection of the writer's residential premises at 5420 Dominion Street by the Municipal Housing Inspector.

Item 18, Municipal Manager's Report No. 34, 1979 April 30, pertaining to this subject, was brought forward for consideration at this time.

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Chief Building Inspector on the subject of the captioned correspondence.

The Chief Building Inspector noted that Mr. Eastman is thoroughly aware of the "sensitivity" of his inspection role, and at all times and in all premises he conducts himself in a civil and polite manner. Regardless of Mr. Eastman's actions and manner, he will suffer complaints from some persons in the conduct of his inspection duties.

His Worship, Mayor Constable, in his capacity as Chairman of the Grants and Publicity Committee, advised Council that the Committee would take no action on this request until such time as the matter of the Burnaby Horsemen's Association Constitution and By-laws had been finalized with the Parks and Recreation Commission.

(h) Edmonds Elementary-Junior Secondary School, Band Representative Re: Permission To Hold A Walk-A-Thon on Sunday, 1979 May 27

A letter dated 1979 April 23 was received requesting permission for the band students at Edmonds-Elementary-Junior Secondary School to hold a Walk-a-thon on Sunday, 1979 May 27.

(i) Province of British Columbia, Ministry Of Tourism And Small Business Development, Honourable E.N. Veitch, Minister Re: Transfer of the Lower Portion of the Oakalla Lands to Burnaby

A letter dated 1979 April 25 was received concerning the transfer of the lower portion of the Oakalla Lands to Burnaby. In order to expedite this, the Provincial Government requires that the conditions of transfer as set forth by the Citizens Committee on the Disposition of Oakalla Lands be met. The conditions are outlined as follows:
"THAT the lower lands be deeded to Burnaby Municipality subject to the following provisals being accepted and implemented:

- Burnaby irrevocably set aside both this land and the adjacent
 Municipal land as presently owned and that designated for acquisition
 for purposes of a park, in perpetuity, for the benefit of all the
 citizens of British Columbia.
- 2. Burnaby undertake immediately a programme with respect to water quality in Deer Lake, which will include the establishment of suitable ground water improvement from the present residential areas and designated park areas to bring water quality to levels acceptable to recreational purposes before major park development is authorized.
- Access to the land described above to be provided as soon as the conditions of these recommendations are accepted by the Municipality of Burnaby."

Upon the receipt of approval, the Minister shall proceed forthwith to transfer ownership of the described lands to the Municipality of Burnaby. It has been stated that it is the intention of the Provincial Government to lease; this is incorrect in that it is the Minister's desire that, subject to conditions set forth by the Committee, the title must be held in fee simple by Burnaby.

Alderman Lawson

Alderman Lawson noted that in a recent news release, that funds to carry out an inventory of equipment and resources that would be available in the event of an oil spill diaster in the region had been approved by the Greater Vancouver Regional District Board.

Provision is also being made for the development of operational and training plans for an oil spill clean-up.

The action follows recommendations made by the G.V.R.D.'s 0il Spill Emergency Measures Committee. The Committee stated that the municipalities should act as front line people to develop operational oil spill clean-up plans for their own areas, and that the role of the G.V.R.D. would be to compile inventories of equipment and expertise which could be shared between the municipalities in the event of an emergency.

It was agreed that Council would receive an informational report from staff on this news release.

Alderman Lawson drew Council's attention to a document recently issued by the City of Dartmouth entitled "Time to Reach Out" issued by the Senior Citizens Shut In Services. Alderman Lawson was of the opinion that this document would be of great value to the Parks and Recreation Commission and to organizations working with the Commission on matters pertaining to senior citizens.

It was agreed that the Municipal Manager would discuss this matter with the Parks and Recreation Administrator.

Alderman Gunn

Alderman Gunn asked if it would be possible for Council at this time to set up a program so that a preliminary discussion of the 1980 Capital Improvement Program Budget could be held in order that Council members would be more conversant with the programs covered in that budget.

His Worship, Mayor Constable, suggested that Alderman Gunn, in his capacity as Finance Liaison Alderman, submit a report to Council at the end of this year outlining his suggested program for a review of the 1980 Capital Improvement Program Budget.

The Director - Fire Services reported that a subsequent search of Department reports, coupled with Mr. F.A. Armstrong's inability to recall the date of the instance has failed to unearth or pin-point any further information. However, in view of Mr. F.A. Armstrong's expressed concern, coupled with the department's experience to date since the road closures were implemented, the following observations are submitted for Council's information:

- The gate located at Sperling Avenue and Canada Way does not present an insurmountable problem in our response to Deer Lake and the adjacent area.
- It should also be noted from Victoria Day to Labour Day, a trained Life Guard is on duty.

The Operational Division of the Burnaby Fire Department have encountered a decided increase in traffic density travelling eastward on Canada Way, expecially during the evening rush. As a consequence to which, an area giving cause for concern is the Rayside and Canada Way section where the road curves to the right with its attendant limited vision. This, when related to the need for emergency vehicles to travel the westbound lanes to circumvent the sometimes stationery traffic backed up from the traffic control lights at Burris Street and Canada Way creates a most dangerous situation.

The detail of the five resolutions proposed for submission to the Union of British Columbia Municipalities is as follows:

 The Provision of a Trust Fund for Required Services as a Condition of Subdivision Approval

WHEREAS the Municipal Act does not presently include provision for a municipality to hold money in trust as a condition of subdivision approval for services that cannot be constructed at the time of subdivision;

AND WHEREAS, under these circumstances, a municipality is faced with expenditures for servicing which should rightly belong to the subdivider of land;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government be requested to amend Section 711 (Subdivision of Land) of the Municipal Act to provide the necessary authority for a municipality to hold money in trust to ensure the future provision of services by the developer involved in the subdivision of land.

 Provision of Compensation to Municipalities for Street Allowance Closures Involving Abutting Private Owners

WHEREAS the right of possession of every public street allowance in a municipality is vested in the municipality under the Municipal Act, subject to any right reserved by the person who dedicated such street allowance;

AND WHEREAS the right of possession of the land forming a public street allowance within its area represents a valuable asset of a municipality;

AND WHEREAS the Plans Cancellation Act provides for the cancellation of street allowances by cancelling or amending a plan of subdivision upon the submission of an application to the Registrar of Land Titles by owners of abutting land;

AND WHEREAS such owners of abutting land are not required to dedicate another street allowance to the municipality but add the cancelled street allowances to their abutting properties without compensation to the municipality;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government be requested to amend the Plans Cancellation Act so that under Plans Cancellation proceedings compensation shall be paid to the municipality for cancelled street allowances which are obtained by the owners of abutting land.

 Provision for the Establishment of Building Lines along Major Streets

WHEREAS the Municipal Act empowers a municipality to regulate the siting of buildings within the various zoning districts included within its area of jurisdiction;

AND WHEREAS this authority does not presently extend to the establishment by a municipality of building lines on any land abutting on any street or road, and for providing that no building shall be erected on such land at a lesser distance from the street or road than indicated by the building line;

AND WHEREAS building lines are an effective means of providing for necessary future street widenings, designating rights-of-way which have been planned but not yet developed, protecting the traffic carrying function of a thoroughfare, and preserving the amenities of buildings along major traffic routes;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government be requested to amend the Municipal Act to provide the necessary authority for a municipality to establish building lines on land abutting an existing and/or proposed major street within its boundaries.

 The Including of the Cost of Parking for Apartment Buildings in the Rent

WHEREAS many municipalities are experiencing excessive on-street parking in areas of apartment development, a situation which gives rise to problems of traffic congestion and increasing hazards to pedestrians;

AND WHEREAS the incentives to use the parking facilities provided by an apartment development area generally lacking due to the prevalent policy of requiring an additional fee, over and above the normal rental, for a parking space, a condition which leaves many parking spaces vacant;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government be requested to amend the Municipal Act to provide the necessary authority for any municipality which wishes to do so to require that apartment owners include the cost of off-street parking in the rent in order to encourage the use of these facilities by the apartment tenants.

5. The Revision of the Present Requirements for Public Hearing Notices in the Advertising of Rezoning Applications

WHEREAS the Municipal Act presently requires that Public Hearing Notices on any proposed amendments to the Zoning By-law having the effect of rezoning an area of a municipality from one zone to another be mailed or otherwise delivered to the occupiers of all real property within the area that is subject to the rezoning, and within a distance specified in a municipal by-law from the area that is subject to the rezoning;

AND WHEREAS this procedure also requires the placing of such a notice, for either the rezoning of land or a zoning by-law text amendment, in not less than two consecutive issues of a newspaper published or circulating in a municipality;

AND WHEREAS the recent amendments to the Municipal Act specify the minimum width, the thickness of the border, the size and type of lettering of a Public Hearing Notice that is placed in a newspaper,

AND WHEREAS these new requirements increase considerably the cost of advertising Public Hearing Notices to a municipality and, through the rezoning fee which will reflect these charges, to the applicant, without increasing the coverage provided to the general public;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government be requested to amend the Municipal Act to delete the regulations prescribing the form and style of printing of Public Hearing Notices under Section 703 (Notice of Public Hearing Regulations).
