REPORT

Appearing on last week's Agenda was a letter from Mary Small, 3754 Norfolk Street, requesting elimination of the ditches in the 3700 Block Norfolk.

No storm sewer exists on this portion of Norfolk Street and recent dye testing has proven that roof drainage from the properties on the south side of Norfolk drains to the ditch in question. It is therefore not possible to eliminate this ditch without piping. Such piping would be installed as part of the continuation of the storm drainage program or through local improvement paving procedures. At present, Norfolk is not included in any such programs. We shall undertake minor regrading of the ditch to ensure water flow to the nearest outfall.

Ms. Small also makes reference to the unsightly appearance of the lumber yard to the west. The Chief Public Health Inspector has requested that the following statement be included in this report.

"The Environmental Health Division investigated the entrance to the Standard Building Supplies' property as to the reported unsightliness. The removal of the minor accumulation of scrap wood and the free kindling wood storage bins from the Norfolk Street entrance was requested. The company has complied with this request."
