Please consider this my application for a concession area within your present facilities at Deerlake and Barnet Park, or others you may suggest, for the rentals of the "Beach Buddie" device to beach patrons.

Enclosed you will find a picture of the "Beach Buddie" which provides a reasonable amount of privacy for the beach patrons as well as solid protection from blowing sand and wind and other elements of annoyance.

Should the Corporation of the District of Burnaby allow my application, R.H.W. Ireland agrees to the following:

To provide sufficient "Beach Buddies" to accommodate the beach activity in each particular area.

And further provide adequate personnel to ensure an orderly degree of conduct in the delivery and return of the "Beach Buddie" rentals.

He will have numbered tickets issued and a corresponding number stamped on the "Beach Buddie" to maintain proper control and for accounting purposes.

It is suggested because of the novelty of the "Beach Buddie" device, a fee of 10% of gross rentals be paid to the Corporation of the District of Burnaby at the end of each fifteen

After a ninety (90) operational day period, a review of the operation be conducted for increasing or decreasing the percentage rate.

The actual rental booth required shall conform to your authority's direction and will not in any way appear offensive to the viewing public.

It would be appreciated if, at the end of each operational day, space could be provided to store over night the "Beach Buddies" in some secure area within your present facility.

It is intended the rental charge will be \$2.50 for an eight hour period or any part thereof and the day will commence at 11:00 A.M. and continue until 7:00 P.M.

It may be that the "Beach Buddie" ownership will not realize a return on capital investment in a one year period and, therefore, I may submit for your consideration that the contract be renewed for five years with reasonable terms for cancellation if both parties shall agree.

I would be pleased to show a proto-type of the "Beach Buddie" device so you can make a visual evaluation.

The area required for the rental booth would approximate $50\ \text{square feet.}$



SETTING UP YOUR "Beach Buddle"

- Your "Beach Buddie" is a snap to put up after removal from its canister.
- Design the layout of your enclosure, bearing in mind the amount of privacy you want, the direction of the wind, and the number of people in your group.
 Try any number of shapes; a square, a circle, etc.
- Force the stakes into the ground, hammering the rubber-tipped ends if the ground is firm.
- Lower the "Beach Buddie" until the packet at the bottom touches the sand or grass. Filling the pocket with sand helps to eliminate most of the wind from seeping in beneath your enclosure. Alternatively, you can use this pocket to store watches, rings, candy or other small items.
- Place a beach blanket or towel on the ground and your "Beach Buddie" retreat is ready for your fun in the sun.

ARRANGEMENT DE VOTRE "Beach Buddie"

- Votre "Beach Buddie" est trés simple à placer aprés l'avoir sortie de la boite.
 Décider un plan pour votre entourage, considérant le montant de solitude que vous désirez; la direction du vent; et le nombre de personnes dans le groupe. Essayer plusieurs formes; carré, cercle, etc.
- En frappant le bout de caoutchouc, forcer les piquets dans le sol.
- Baisser le "Beach Baby" jusqu'à ce que la poche au bas touche le sol où le gazon.
 Remplir la poche avec du sable aide a éliminer le vent dans l'entourage. De même façon, employer la poche à tenir les montres, baques et toutes articles.
- Placer une cauverture où serviette de plage dans votre entourage, et votre retraite est compléte.
