REPORT

Council on 1980 January 07 approved the motion:

" THAT staff look into the possibility of funding the Entry Sign at St. Thomas More School proposed by the Burnaby Beautification Committee and having NIP funds made available to do that job. "

The Eastburn NIP program has effectively reached the prescribed date for project completion, as set down by the Federal and Provincial Governments.

With Council's approval of the Tree Planting program, all of the monies available under the terms of the Eastburn NIP program have been either expended or allocated to specific projects.
