
Recommendation:

REPORT

The Corporation of Burnaby has been invited by the Government of British Columbia to bid on the 1982/83 Summer and Winter Games.

Staff, in their consideration of this invitation, investigated the requirements of hosting the Summer or Winter games. The following summation briefly outlines what the application process entails:

The bid submission must provide details on:

1. Municipalities financial contributions
2. A program and budget for hosting 18-22 sporting events
3. Athletes transportation and room and board capabilities
4. Estimations of facility upgrading costs and the facility availability
5. Assurance of community agency and organization support, and commitment must be provided
6. Also a commitment from individuals to form a Summer Games Committee. This Committee would organize and deliver the games.

These commitments and preliminary plans would take a number of months to arrange. It is therefore recommended that the staff begin the planning process and identification of the necessary community resources and personnel with the objective of making a bid for the 1984 Summer Games.

Mr. Butlin, the Games Chairman, has informed staff that the bids for the 1984 games will be invited in the spring of 1982.

It is staffs recommendation that a bid be made on the next invitation.
