## RECOMMENDATION:

THAT this report be received for information and that the matter be dealt with directly between the police and the party concerned.

## REPORT

- 1. After receipt of the letter from the President of Simpson Power Products Ltd., dated 80-04-10, directed to the "Mayor and Council", we contacted Mr. Simpson by telephone. We made tentative arrangements to meet Mr. Simpson and other businessmen in the immediate area to discuss the problem which has been identified.
- 2. File records confirm reports of thefts of the nature related in the letter and from the police viewpoint, we share the concerns expressed. The emphasis in the letter is directed toward "stepped up presence of the police" on this street, however, controlling thefts of this type must be approached with a view of applying other alternatives. Whilst we may at times be able to direct more frequent patrols to the area, it must be kept in mind all other areas throughout the Municipality are deserving of equal police protection. The improved security measures within the establishments can provide a deterrent toward curtailing thefts and/or other offences.
- 3. We look to the meeting being beneficial to the business establishments and the police.
