REPORT

A list of outstanding report items from the Planning Department, which have been directly initiated by the Council, is attached. These items represent approximately 20% of the department's work load.

This list updated from the previous report submitted on 1979 October 01, follows the order in which the items were requested. In each case the "current status" is shown, and as requested at the informal Council meeting held on 1980 January 03, an estimate of the number of man months (professional, technical and clerical) involved in completing each item is provided. Also shown are the general priority designations allocated by Council under the following three categories:

- "A" First Priority (being actively pursued at present)
- "B" Second Priority (to be commenced shortly with completion in the foreseeable future)
- Third Priority (long range items)

Items that were listed in the preceding report of 1979 October 01 and completed since that time include the following:

A further seven reports which were initiated by the Council since the compilation of the last list (1979 October 01) were completed prior to this present report. These included a proposed Zoning By-law text amendment for lands within the designated flood plain; the leasing of parking space from high rise apartments for business purposes; request for Class "A" liquor licence for Brentwood Lanes; testing program for land fill sites in the Big Bend Area; information on National Harbours Board leases; school requirements in Burnaby 200 project area; and Deer Lake Park dedication by-law.

A total of six new items have been added to the list since the last status report was prepared, including an approach to a methodical review of community plans; population growth and residential development; growth management; Discovery Parks - development projects; Hastings Street Urban Renewal (proposal call); and Centaurus Circle enquiries.

The 20% of the department's work load devoted to Council initiated items is equivalent to 90 man months available within the department during 1980 for this category of work. It is estimated that the attached list would require a total of 180 man months or two years to complete provided no other items are added to the list. In practice this work load and the period of time required to complete it remains fairly constant as new priority items are added to take the place of those that are completed; or items are initiated and completed without appearing on the quarterly status report.

In the light of the above information it is our intention prior to the next report to provide Council with a more realistic division of items by deleting the term priority and dividing the work into the following three categories:

Category "A" — All avilable Departmental time to be devoted to these items, which would be drawn to contain those items which represent one year's work load for the Department.

Category "B" — A list from which items are raised to Category "A", when sufficient time available.

Category "C" — Items which will not be undertaken by the Department until an urgent need develops for their completion, or Council specifically moves them into Category "A".

This is for the information of Council.
