 ENFORCEMENT OF A TRAFFIC RESTRICTION AT SPERLING AVENUE SOUTH OF CANADA WAY

The following report from the Municipal Engineer is in response to a letter from Mr. Bruce M. McKay that appeared on last week's agenda.

SUMMARY:

Enforcement action has been taken and will be continued against the motorists who ignore the one-way restriction recently imposed on Sperling Avenue south of Canada Way.


REPORT:

In response to the 1980 10 20 submission of Mr. Bruce M. McKay of 5178 Sperling Avenue regarding violations of the designated one-way northbound section of Sperling Avenue south of Canada Way we would advise that the R.C.M.P. were requested to take enforcement action.

Enforcement to date has been limited to the 1600 - 1800 hour period when we would expect the highest number of violations. In a three day period, 1980 October 22 - 24, covering approximately five hours of observation a total of 24 tickets were issued.

Enforcement action is continuing and will be extended to non-rush hour periods as well.

It has been our experience in similar circumstances that some motorists will always attempt to ignore a newly installed traffic restriction. However when it becomes obvious that the regulation is being enforced the number of violations diminish and very seldom do you apprehend the same individual twice.
