## **REPORT**

Appearing under Correspondence at its 1980 April 28 meeting was a letter from Mr. & Mrs. J. Simpson concerning the Burnaby Lakers Hockey Club who were unable to host the league playoffs at an arena in Burnaby.

Staff received a telephone inquiry in mid March from a coach of the Lakers asking about ice time in April. He was informed the ice was being taken out of both rinks on 1980 March 31 and that a commitment had already been made to the Burnaby Minor Lacrosse Association to commence their season on 1980 April 10.

Approximately 10 days are required to remove the ice, clean and dry the floor to prepare for lacrosse which involves approximately 500 youths 6 to 16 years.

With greater warning time, such a request could, and most certainly would be considered as was done with the Blazers Junior team in the 1978/79 season.

Staff will ensure in the future that all hockey clubs are formally advised that if they have a chance of making the play-offs, ice-time should be tentatively arranged in early February prior to commitments being made for lacrosse.
