REPORT OF THE GRANTS AND PUBLICITY COMMITTEE

Madam/Gentlemen:

Your Committee would report as follows:

<u>Application No.</u>		<u>Recommendation</u>
1.	<u>Big Sisters of Greater Vancouver</u> Big Sisters offer a program to girls between the ages of 7 - 18 who are in need of assistance. The program consists of trained volunteers giving counselling service on a one-to-one basis. The program is supplemented by a variety of activities such as camping, swimming, skating, crafts and fund-raising projects. The grant for 1979 was \$2,000.00 and for 1980, \$2,200.00. The Grants Committee for 1981 is recommending a grant of \$2,500.00.	\$2,500.00
2.	<u>Burnaby Horsemen's Association</u> The Committee would recommend that an amount equal to 1980 taxes plus penalties be transferred from the Grants and Publicity Committee account to the Burnaby Horseman's Association.	\$4,007.68 for 1980 taxes (plus penalties).
3.	<u>The Columbian Trade and Industry Progress Edition</u> For a number of years the Columbian has been publishing a Trade and Industry Edition. The main objective appears to be "the business and industrial leaders of the Lower Mainland and gives special prominence to the vital role that Industry and Commerce plays in the development and growth of our Province." In addition it gives publicity to the industrial development areas of the municipalities of the Lower Mainland. There was no advertisement taken in 1980 as the request was received after the Grants budget had been exhausted.	\$ 505.00

3.	The Committee would recommend that a ¼ page advertisement be placed for the 1981 edition. Approximate cost \$505.00.	
4.	<u>Gilmore Pre-School</u> The Gilmore Pre-School is an association formed by the residents of the Burnaby Heights area. It is a non-profit association formed to provide a place for 3 and 4 year old children using Gilmore School. The Committee would recommend \$200.00 as a one time grant to be used towards purchase of equipment	\$ 200.00
5.	<u>Italian Folk Society of British Columbia</u> The Committee recommends that no grant be given. The request is outside the policy and guidelines of the Grants and Publicity Committee and could foster more requests from around the world.	Nil
6.	<u>Kiwanis Music Festival</u> The Kiwanis Music Festival is held annually and is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Vancouver. This is the 58th year of operation. The aim of the festival is to provide children in the Lower Mainland with an opportunity to improve their musical talent and encourage them in pursuing their particular chosen field of music. Scholarships are awarded to winning participants. For the past 6 years Council has given a grant of \$500.00. However, by majority your Committee would recommend this year that no grant be given.	Nil
7.	<u>Life Line Society</u> The Life Line Society is a non profit society incorporated under the Societies Act in 1973. They are funded by the Ministry of Human Resources and the Ministry of Health as well as private donations. Council, in 1980, approved a grant of \$4,000.00 to cover the amount required for rent for June to the year end to assist in the start up costs. Your Committee would recommend that a grant of \$3,000.00, equivalent to taxes be given to offset cost of rent. The amount of taxes for 1981 is 1,965.30. Your Committee feels that this is consistent with past dealings with other Societies. The Committee feels the balance of the rent is the responsibility of the Department of Human Resources.	\$3,000.00
