**COMMENTS ON CRIME TRENDS AND POLICING PROBLEMS:**

A 26-year-old Burnaby male has been charged with murder of a 76-year-old female Burnaby resident, after a beating at the victim's residence.

A 56-year-old Burnaby female is dead as the result of a two-vehicle accident on Canada Way. The deceased was a passenger in a vehicle which made a lefthand turn into the path of an oncoming vehicle. No charges are contemplated.

A 65-year-old Vancouver female has died as the result of injuries sustained in a May accident. The deceased was a passenger in a vehicle driven by her husband. A charge has been laid.

The total accidents are up considerably over previous years' figures. One very prominent contributing factor is suggested to be the extremely wet conditions, causing above normal inattentiveness on the part of drivers and stopping distance is directly affected. The injury accident total and property damage likewise has a direct relationship. Unfortunately, an identical upward trend in statistics is evident throughout other Lower Mainland areas, including Vancouver City.

The fatalities recorded this year are up by three for the same period last year. A review of causes leads me to be satisfied that even with stepped up enforcement, there is no suggestion the total would have been reduced. The enforcement index has fluctuation from month to month and here again the overall results are compatible with adjoining areas.

The crime statistics record variances in the Criminal Code, Federal statutes and Provincial statutes with an overall increase of 422. This, according to figures released by other areas, even outside of the province, is a general trend being experienced. The overall clearance rate is up slightly for the month, but down over the year to date. It is not unusual to observe fluctuation as often when arrests are made, many outstanding unsolved crimes are related.

We will continue monitoring these statistics and ensure that our crime prevention and law enforcement programs meet or exceed the norm for other jurisdictions in the Lower Mainland.
