RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT this report be received by Council for information.

SUMMARY

This report is to clarify that residents will not be required to pay cremation fees for their pet if they deliver it to the animal shelter for disposal.

REPORT

During Council's deliberation of the report on dog licence, impoundment and disposal fees (Municipal Manager's Report No. 59, Item 17, 1981 November 23) it was concluded that the 15¢ per pound cremation disposal fee to be paid by commercial users would also be applicable to residents who deliver the body of their own pet to the shelter for incineration. This is not the case.

Calculation of incinerator fuel and maintenance costs determined that approximately 50% of use results from material from commercial users. The rate of 15¢ per pound for such service was recommended to recover the estimated corresponding costs. One dollar from each licence fee that is collected from dog owners will be used to recover the remaining 50% of incineration costs. Therefore, residents will not be required to pay the 15 cents per pound rate if their dog's body is delivered to the animal shelter.

The report was somewhat misleading in that it implied that \$1.00 of each licence fee would not be designated for cremation of dogs.
