3. Hastings Street Urban Renewal Site, 3800-3900 Hastings Street

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Director of Planning regarding the Hastings Street Urban Renewal Site.

The Director of Planning reported that renewed interest in seeing the Hastings Street Urban Renewal scheme concluded has led to the preparation of a new plan and development approach for the Urban Renewal Site which reflects the Residential Growth Management Study prepared in 1980.

This revised plan with its reduced development densities, and the proposal to sell and develop one of the key sites for mixed residential/commercial use, and to develop an adjacent site as a public park has been approved by the Federal and Provincial governments, and generally endorsed except as to building height by the North Burnaby Ratepayers who are engaged in a review of the Community Plan for the area within which the Urban Renewal Site is located. The Community group has expressed a preference for senior citizens residential accommodation; for commercial development on the main floor; for a terrace type structure, setback 10 ft. from the curb to a maximum height of four storeys; and for the development of Site 1 and a portion of Site 2 to include a park type setting.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- THAT Council endorse the plan and development approach described in this report for the Hastings Street Urban Renewal Site.
- (2) THAT staff be authorized to call for proposals as described in this report for the sale and development of Site 3, to include the integral design and development of Site 1 for public park.
- (3) THAT in addition to advertising the proposal call in area newspapers; all those who have expressed a development interest, either verbally or in writing to Council or staff, be advised of the Council action.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN AST:

- (3) THAT the Municipal Manager administer this Annual Budget on a global basis until such time as a working Recast Budget can be prepared and presented to the Municipal Council for approval.

Notice may be waived by unanimous vote of all the members of Council. Each copy of the notice shall be signed by the Mayor or Clerk; and

<u>WHEREAS</u> it is deemed desirable and expedient to waive the leaving of the meeting notice for each member of Council:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that under authority of Section 219(1) of the Municipal Act the leaving of the meeting notice for each member of Council be waived in connection with the possible ratification of a labour settlement." CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Alderman Stusiak then provided a verbal progress report on the present status of negotiations between the Greater Vancouver Regional District and the Canadian Union of Public Employees relative to the current work stoppage.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN AST: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN LAWSON:

"THAT this Regular Council Meeting do now adjourn."
