Madam and Gentlemen:

Your Committee would report as follows:

<u>Application No.</u>		<u>Recommendation</u>
51.	Fraser Correctional Resources Society (P.U.R.P.O.S.E.)	\$3,000.

P.U.R.P.O.S.E. offers intensive counselling, a life-skills program and recreational service to delinquent and pre-delinquent youth of Burnaby.

Although referrals are accepted from other areas, the majority of participants in the program come from Burnaby. During the period September 1979 to January 1981 a total of 132 juveniles were involved in the afternoon and evening programs, 93 of whom resided in Burnaby.

For the years 1977 to 1980 inclusive, P.U.R.P.O.S.E. received a municipal grant of \$2,500. each year.

Your Committee would recommend a grant in the amount of \$3,000. for 1981.
