Selected detachment personnel are involved in the coordinated extensive investigation regarding "missing youths" in the lower mainland, as one of the missing youths is a Burnaby resident.
 A one-night incident of attack on residents and upon parked vehicles by firing shot-gun blasts is continuing to receive investigational attention. To date however, sufficient evidence is not available to lay criminal charges.

The three reported traffic fatalities for July involved:

- (1) A 13 year old New Westminster girl who ran into the side of a moving vehicle causing her to fall beneath the wheels of a trailer being pulled.
No charges laid.
- (2) A 70 year old Coquitlam passenger died following a five-car collision, when the vehicle in which he was riding failed to stop at a stop sign.
Charges were laid.
- (3) Investigation is continuing after a Hit & Run vehicle struck a 70 year old Burnaby male when he was pushing his bicycle across a North Burnaby street.

The upward trend in traffic accidents and property damage is consistent with the overall trend experienced by neighbouring locations and is being closely monitored.
