A \$32,000 mobile home has been recovered after a 22-year-old male escapee from Manitoba was arrested while in possession of it. Investigation proved this same subject was responsible for eight Burnaby business break-ins prior to his arrest.

Continuous investigations into reported Break and Entries during December resulted in clearing 19 offences committed by two Surrey youths, ages 18 and 19. A 21-year-old was found responsible for 11 offences and an 18-year-old, now in custody in Calgary, is known to have committed 30 offences in our area before he was arrested.

A 15-year-old female from Coquitlam died in hospital, the result of head injuries sustained when the car in which she was a passenger was struck from the rear, when stopped at a stop sign. Charges are pending against a 37-year-old male from New Westminster.

A 66-year old Burnaby male was pronounced dead on arrival at hospital following a pedestrian-vehicle accident. The victim attempted to cross a poorly lighted street in front of oncoming traffic. He was wearing dark clothing and it was raining heavily. The vehicle travelling in the fast lane was unable to take evasive action and struck the victim. No charges are to be laid.

The 12-month summary shows 7 more fatalities in 1981 than 1980. My views and comments regarding fatalities were submitted to council on 81 NOV 23 (Manager's Report No. 59). Our efforts to search for solutions to reduce this fatality total will continue.

The overall offence totals are up from 1980, and the clearance rate reflects an increase also.

The total accident tally is up 775 over 1980, however, the unusual type of wet climate was a possible contributing factor and when compared with other neighbouring areas, this percentage increase is reasonably consistent with the overall trend for 1981. Increased enforcement practises and constant review of patterns, etc. will continue.
