1. THAT Council endorse the recommendations contained in the submission dated 1982 April 16 from the Lower Mainland Planning Review Panel.


REPORT

Appearing on the Council Agenda on 1982 May 03 was a submission from Mr. Bryant, Chairman of the Lower Mainland Planning Review Panel, containing proposals approved by the Panel in response to the options for intermunicipal planning for this region which were outlined by the Minister of Municipal Affairs in conjunction with Bill 9 and the Minister's letter of 1982 March 23.

The report and recommendations have been reviewed by the Technical Planning Committee of the Greater Vancouver Regional District at a meeting attended by the Director Planning & Building Inspection.

Burnaby's Council has taken the position that Bill 9 - The Land Use Act - is unacceptable and has requested that the Minister of Municipal Affairs withdraw the proposed Bill. It should be noted that the recommendations contained in the subject report do not imply any change in the view held by Burnaby with respect to Bill 9. The recommendations are considered to be valid whether Bill 9 is passed or not. That is to say, the recommendations would be pertinent if Bill 9 were to be adopted and they are equally valid as proposals for amendments to the Municipal Act if Bill 9 is not adopted.

The Planning & Building Inspection Department commends these recommendations to Council for consideration and would recommend their endorsement in order to improve the provisions for intermunicipal planning and coordination in the region.
