RE: BRUNETTE RIVER BASIN TOUR

Madam/Gentlemen:

A tour of the Brunette River Basin, including parts of Eagle Creek and Stoney Creek was held on Monday, 1981 December 14 to view problems that affect the existing and proposed Federal-Provincial Salmonoid Enhancement Program, which includes chum and coho salmon and steelhead and cut-throat trout.

The tour was guided by the Federal Fisheries Officer in co-operation with the Provincial Fish and Wildlife Officer and there was representation from the Federal Fisheries and Oceans, Provincial Fish and Wildlife, Greater Vancouver Regional District Sewerage and Drainage, Planning and Parks and the Municipality of Burnaby Manager, Planning, Engineering and Health Departments.

It was agreed at the subsequent meeting that the Federal Fisheries Officer and Provincial Fish and Wildlife Officer would co-operate on a joint recommendation regarding a prioritized list of streams suitable for fish habitat and a draft of a stream management plan for the Brunette River Basin, including Burnaby Lake, Still Creek and Deer Lake. This should be completed by 1982 February.

Following receipt of this report I will propose the organization of another tour for any interested members of Council and Greater Vancouver Regional District.

This is a progress report for the information of Council.
