The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Chief Licence Inspector concerning the licencing of dogs.

The Chief Licence Inspector reported that since 1976 we have bi-annually conducted a door-to-door canvass for unlicenced dogs and bicycles. In our experience, many owners fail to renew their licences, and by mid year will probably not do so unless they are directly approached. Persons who acquire their first dog or bicycle may be unaware of licencing requirements. The object of canvassing is to achieve equitable application of the licencing requirements. Several other jurisdictions in the Greater Vancouver area conduct similar programs.

The costs of operating this program are not supported by general tax revenue. In the past revenue collected by the canvassers has exceeded the operating costs. Analysis of this year's program indicates that we should readily achieve the same results.

The Minister advised that grants will only be paid for work completed on those programs which are approved. If the program as approved has not been fully completed, the amount paid will depend on the proportion of the approved program accomplished.

It is recognized that unforeseen circumstances may cause the delay, cancellation, replacement, or alteration of programs or their cost. Should this be the case, it is possible to obtain approval of a reallocation of grant funds to other programs, provided they meet the requirements of the Ministry's letter of 1981 December 18. However, because of the complete allocation of program funds, there can be no increase in the amount of the grant.
