A copy of a letter from the Minister of Finance to Fibermold Products Manufacturing Ltd. dated 1982 July 30 was received

relative to 1982 property taxes. The Minister advised that he was deeply concerned over the many financial problems currently facing the business community. However, the adjustments that can be made to property taxes at this time of year are extremely limited. School District and Municipal budgets have been developed on the assumption that the tax base will remain fixed for 1982. To change the structure of the tax base at this time would cause widespread disruption throughout local governments. Therefore, although the Minister of Municipal Affairs has indicated the government's willingness to examine corrective measures, it may be that changes are not possible for the 1982 taxation year. If this is the case, the Minister gave assurance that positive measures will be considered prior to the distribution of the 1983 tax notices.

90th Birthday Committee, SecretaryRe: Approval for parade - Monday, 1982 September 13

A letter dated 1982 August 19 was received outlining the plans of the 90th Birthday Committee to hold a parade on 1982 September 13 from the Municipal Hall to Heritage Village. This notice required the owner to bring the property into compliance with the Burnaby Unsightly Premises Bylaw within two weeks by the removal of accumulated garbage, waste building materials, tree cuttings and miscellaneous debris, and thereafter to maintain the property in a neat and tidy condition at all times.

In 1982 August 16 an inspection of 6211 Sumas Street revealed that the property has now been brought into compliance with the Burnaby Unsightly Premises Bylaw.

19. Relocation of Ministry of Transportation And Highways Works Yard

The Acting Municipal Manager provided a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection regarding the relocation of the Ministry of Transportation and Highways Works Yard.

The following are the recommendations of the Director Planning and Building Inspection in this regard:

1. THAT notwithstanding the conclusion reached that the Highway Works Yard on Site 3 would have no ramifications on the negotiations with the Federal Government concerning the disposition and future use of the George Derby Lands, the Ministry of Transportation & Highways be advised that the three sites in the Stormont-Cariboo Area are not considered appropriate for the proposed development of a Highways Works Yard.

- 2. THAT should the Ministry prefer a location within this Municipality that it be requested to reconsider the proposed use of Municipal lands in the Norland-Darnley Avenue area for their relocated works yard as previously submitted to them by Planning Department staff given its appropriate industrial zoning and the unavailability of the Stormont-Cariboo sites.
- 3. THAT should Council agree to accommodate the Highways Works Yard in the Stormont-Cariboo Area, Site 3 be designated subject to:
 - a. The development criteria as outlined in the attached report (Attachment 2) dated 1982 May 10 be accepted by the Ministry of Transportation and Highways as a condition of the sale and development of the site.
 - b. The Legal and Lands Department be directed to negotiate the sale of the subject site to the Ministry of Transportation and Highways.
 - c. The Planning & Building Inspection Department be authorized to work with the Ministry of Transportation and Highways towards a suitable plan of development that would be the basis of a subsequent rezoning to CD (Comprehensive Development).

The Acting Municipal Manager noted that the Director Planning & Building Inspection now advises:

".... It can now be reported that the use of Site 3 as a highways works yard would have no ramifications on the land use of the George Derby Hospital lands between Highway #1 and the proposed Stormont-McBride connector because of the agreement reached for its use as an open space."

This effectively removes the Manager's main concerns expressed in the 1982 April 05 Report to Council.

The Acting Municipal Manager does not recommend either Site 1 or Site 2, but does recommend Site 3, utilizing the formerly expressed concept of "Expanding" the highway right-of-way at Stormont interchange.
