(b) Burnaby Board of Variance, Chairman, Re: Existing stores permitted as conditional approved uses in specified residential districts

A letter dated 1982 March 26 was received concerning additions and upgrading of existing legally non-conforming grocery stores in the Municipality of Burnaby.

It was the opinion of the Board of Variance that such corner or neighbour-hood grocery stores perform a useful and welcome function in most residential areas in which they are situated, and it would be of benefit to everybody concerned if action were taken to amend the zoning bylaw whereby such existing stores would be permitted as conditional approved uses in specified residential districts.

It was the understanding of the Board of Variance that the City of Vancouver has taken action along such lines. The Chairman of the Board of Variance commended to Council the development of the grocery store located at the southeast corner of Walker Avenue and Stanley Street in Burnaby which resulted from decisions of the Board of Variance a few years ago.

Item 5, Municipal Manager's Report No. 23, 1982, pertaining to this subject, was brought forward for consideration at this time.

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Director Planning & Building Inspection on the subject of concern to the Burnaby Board of Variance.

The Director Planning & Building Inspection noted that the proposal by the Board at this time is that the Council amend the zoning bylaw to provide for such existing stores as conditionally approved uses under existing residential zoning. The authority for municipalities to zone land is set out in Section 716 of the Municipal Act and the Municipal Solicitor advises that he is not aware of any enabling legislation that would permit municipalities to exercise discretion and to introduce conditional uses. For information, Council is advised that the City of Vancouver does utilize conditional zoning, but it must be recalled that Vancouver operates under its Charter, and that it cannot, as a result, be used as a model for other cities or municipalities which derive their authority from the Municipal Act. There is no basis in law for the municipality to amend its bylaw to provide for conditional uses.

In summary, the municipality does not have the authority to introduce conditional uses into its zoning bylaw, but an avenue for recognition and redevelopment of such uses is provided via the Cl zoning districts where warranted upon consideration of its merit on a site specific basis.

The house is sited at 7037 Canada Way and because of traffic, noise and dust, the writers wish to relocate it on the back of the adjacent lot to front on Ramsay Avenue. It is the writers' intention to remain in this particular neighbourhood. Although the house is over 35 years old, it was custom built and is still in sound original condition. Nickel Brothers House Moving Company has given assurance there is no problem regarding its physical move.

Item 11, Municipal Manager's Report No. 23, 1982, pertaining to this subject, was brought forward for consideration at this time.

- (2) THAT the staff determine the related development criteria required to accommodate the Highway Works Yard on Site 3.
- (3) THAT this information be reported to Council prior to a final decision being made on the use of Site 3 as a Highway Works Yard.

14. Refuse Service for Rental Apartments

The Municipal Manager provided a report from the Director Engineering concerning refuse service for rental apartments.

The Director Engineering advised that some work has been done in determining the various ramifications to Burnaby of providing the refuse services requested by the Rental Housing Council of B.C. There is a need, however, for further discussions with other municipal departments concerning possible alternatives. It will not be possible to submit a final report on this subject for approximately two months.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

ENQUIRIES

ALDERMAN BROWN:

Alderman Brown reported that three tractor trailer units were being parked on Roseberry Avenue, north of Marine Drive and requested that the R.C.M.P. be advised of this in order that corrective action can be taken.

The Director Engineering advised that his department was aware of the situation at this point and that the Burnaby Detachment, R.C.M.P. had been advised accordingly.

Alderman Brown further enquired as to the number of meetings which were held by the Greater Vancouver Regional District in the Burnaby Municipal Hall and if there was any involvement of municipal staff in these meetings.

His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, advised that the facilities of the Municipal Hall were utilized by the Greater Vancouver Regional District approximately twice a month and that there was no involvement of municipal staff in these meetings.

ALDERMAN MCLEAN:

Alderman McLean noted that throughout the municipality there are a number of roads which have been permanently closed. It would appear that some of these 66 foot road allowances would be suitable for residential building lots in many cases. Alderman McLean suggested that the Director Planning & Building Inspection should examine these road allowances and determine the legal ramifications so that the road ends could be legally sold as residential lots.

The Acting Manager reported that it is the aim of the Director Planning & Building Inspection to make optimum use of the land. If there is a road allowance that is not required, ways of fitting it into the subdivision will be examined, either by creating a lot or making a larger lot in some other development. The Acting Manager considered that this question was fairly well in hand in the sense that each situation was closely examined as it occurred.

ALDERMAN STUSIAK:

Alderman Stusiak advised Council that at a recent meeting of the Burnaby Beautification Committee a member of the Planning Department had applied pressure to the Committee to support the undergrounding of the overhead trolley bus wires on Hastings Street. The Planning Department staff member had apparently informed the Committee that the installation of the overhead wires would preclude the planting of trees on Hastings Street as proposed by the Beautification Committee. Alderman Stusiak enquired if it was Planning Department policy to apply pressure to other groups to support the Planning Department in similar instances.

The Acting Municipal Manager advised that the undergrounding of trolley wires on Hastings Street referred only to the undergrounding of the main power source to the overhead cables. It was not the policy of the Planning Department to apply pressure to any group to gain support for their views.

Alderman Stusiak further enquired if the Planning Department considered that the planting of trees on Hastings Street would be incompatible with the overhead trolley wires.

The Acting Municipal Manager advised that the Planning Department had recommended that the tree planting program on Hastings Street be held in abeyance until such time as the overhead trolley wires were in place. The siting of the required poles to carry the trolley wires was not known at this time. In order to avoid future conflict it would be advisable to withhold the planting of the trees until such time as the overhead lines had been constructed.

ALDERMAN DRUMMOND:

Alderman Drummond noted that the 1982 Provincial Budget had been delivered in the Legislature earlier today and enquired as to when the municipalities would be advised of specific revenues which may be expected.

His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, advised that the Treasurer would be in touch with Victoria by telephone tomorrow and that Council would be advised of any information available in this respect as soon as possible.
