#### CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

(a) Ms. Elsie W. Dean, 5285 Empire Drive, then addressed the members of Council regarding public transit in Burnaby. The text of Ms. Dean's submission is contained hereunder:

"I am here this evening to express my concern over the B.C. Government takeover of all authority for transit in our municipality, and to ask this Council to stand behind the Greater Vancouver Regional District's position that transit is a local responsibility, and also to ask the Government in Victoria to enter into meaningful negotiations to develop a framework for the establishment of an effective, accountable Regional Transit Authority. My concern first and foremost is for the future of public transit in our community, because public transit is a major concern for this community. You know that this Council, of course, is plagued week after week by delegations who come asking for some relief from the traffic problems in their neighbourhoods, and I believe a good and viable public transit system would go a long way to relieving this situation. However, in order to meet regional and local priorities, I believe our transit system must have local input and that the G.V.R.D., with its direct appointment from local municipal Councils, is more accessible and responsible than the B.C. Transit, which is run by the Government in Victoria. Mr. Vander Zalm said himself he would appoint his favourites, then we see that there is no real decision making powers given to this appointed body. Livability of our neighbourhood is not a priority for Victoria, in particular, and for its Crown controlled B.C. Transit Corporation. What consideration will be given to the residents around the stations that will have a new influx of traffic in their neighbourhoods with the completion of the A.L.R.T. line. Good planning to save the neighbourhoods is not a particular priority of Victoria, but it is, or should be, a priority of this Council. Even now we hear that as of this month 1100 hours per week are to be cut from the bus service, this to save approximately \$2 million at the expense of a viable public transit system. We recall that Vander Zalm's A.L.R.T. decisions made without public tender pretends to be a very expensive transit system. This is clearly a foretaste of the way in which expensive transit decisions will be made if a responsible body of locally elected people are not Now we see that decisions are being made in Victoria by Orders in Council and the G.V.R.D. is left with ill-defined responsibilities for transit, while relieving it of all control. So despite his phoney claims to be simplifying the decision making process, Vander Zalm's new Transit Commission merely adds an additional level of bureaucracy closely allied to the B.C. Transit. I think the Province is attempting to grab transit in order to hide the horrendous costs of A.L.R.T., and to guarantee that the transit system serves the government priorities, and I would suggest that B.C. Place and B.C. Place Stadium are two of those favourite developments along with the New Westminster Downtown Development Corporation. question that comes to mind is how soon will they scrap the concept of the projected G.V.R.D. planners for an integrated Greater Vancouver Transit The A.L.R.T. was just to be a small part of that overall system as System. we know that it will simply be an elevated shuttle service between New Westminster and downtown Vancouver, but does not constitute a viable public It makes one wonder if the cuts taking place this month transit system. are the beginning of a skuttling of a regular bus system. Vander Zalm has already misled the G.V.R.D. about financing. financing? He has already indicated his desire to finance transit out of property taxes, which is the same pocket out of which our municipalities presently raise most of their money. To raise the \$145 million now needed would mean an additional six or seven mills in our municipality, but when we start paying for the capital costs for A.L.R.T. this would double and the property tax could be 12 to 14 mills. Add to that all the fine tuning we must do to make the A.L.R.T. system operable, such as the escalators for Burnaby at a cost of nearly \$3 million, which also must come out of our taxes, and who knows how much more of the bits and pieces we will have to add before we

finally get the system operating. Are we going to have any say in this? The very idea of the Provincial Government being able to levy a property tax in our municipality violates the principle of taxation with no representation. We are presently picking up the larger share of transit costs through gas and hydro tax right in the Greater Vancouver Regional District, unlike what the Government in Victoria claims. The facts are that we are picking up the greater share.

In closing I say that I am surprised that Alderman Emmott and Mayor Lewarne voted against the majority on the G.V.R.D. and favoured the take-over of all transit authority by Victoria. I consider that they are engaged in a conflict of interest by sitting as our representatives on the G.V.R.D. and making decisions to transfer power to B.C. Transit. I understand that Mayor Lewarne is appointed to the Commission and has accepted that appointment. Do these two municipally elected representatives have no faith in the government that they are responsible for to govern in the best interests of the people who elected them that they act to turn that responsibility over to another authority. I urge this Council as a body to support the majority decision of the G.V.R.D. and call on the government in Victoria to enter into meaningful negotiations with the G.V.R.D. to develop a framework for the establishment of an effective, accountable Regional Transit Authority, that this Council support the premise that transit is recognized as a local responsibility requiring significant financial support Thank you." from senior governments.

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Engineering regarding a traffic problem at Kitchener Street and Holdom Avenue.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT the requests of Mr. Rizzo and Mr. Ciapponi, as conveyed by Mr. Crestani, be denied.
- (2) THAT a checkerboard warning sign be installed at the intersection of Holdom Avenue and Kitchener Street for westbound traffic.
- (3) THAT Mr. Rizzo, Mr. Ciapponi and Mr. Crestani be sent copies of this report.

14. Water supply to service Burnaby Mountain Centennial Park Pavilion and surrounding park areas

- (3) THAT the proposal received from the consulting engineering firm of Dayton and Knight Ltd. for provision of the required engineering services be accepted and that an Engineering Agreement be entered into with the company for the services.

- (4) THAT tenders be called for the required water system replacement work as soon as the consultant has the drawings and documents updated.
- (5) THAT a copy of this report be sent to the Parks and Recreation Commission.

### ALDERMAN DRUMMOND:

Alderman Drummond advised that he wished to bring back for reconsideration the motion adopted by Council as contained on page 4 of the minutes of the Council Meeting that was held on 1983 March 07.

### MOVED BY ALDERMAN DRUMMOND: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN NIKOLAI:

"THAT the motion as moved by Alderman Stusiak and seconded by Alderman Constable: 'That when requests dealing with traffic are coming to Council they be referred to the Traffic Safety Committee, Transportation Committee, or the Planning and Building Inspection Department", be now reconsidered."

A vote was then taken on the original motion as moved by Alderman Stusiak and seconded by Alderman Constable: 'That when requests dealing with traffic are coming to Council they be referred to the Trafic Safety Committee, Transportation Committee, or the Planning and Building Inspection Department', and same was CARRIED with Aldermen Brown, Drummond and Nikolai opposed.

#### MAYOR LEWARNE

His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, wished to thank the citizens of Burnaby for the privilege that His Worship had this past week in representing Burnaby during the visit of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, in both dining with Her Majesty on the evening of Wednesday, 1983 March 09 and being in New Westminster to receive her there on Thursday, 1983 March 10. His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, commented that the experience was one of the highlights of his life.

### ENQUIRIES

#### ALDERMAN BROWN:

Alderman Brown advised that he had received three (3) telephone calls from people residing along Pender Street in reference to the recently installed experimental roundabouts. Alderman Brown stated that the individuals felt that the roundabouts should be wider than those constructed and the signing should be similar to that in Vancouver. People approaching the intersection and wishing to make a left turn are cutting to the left and making the turn rather than turning to the right and circling around the roundabout and then proceeding in the direction they wish to turn. Alderman Brown enquired as to whether the Engineering Department will be continuing to maintain the roundabouts as one of the roundabouts was vandalized during this past weekend.

In response to Alderman Brown's enquiry, the Director Engineering advised that the roundabouts will continue to be maintained and repaired immediately upon sustaining any damage.

Alderman Brown further enquired as to the status of the bus shelter program with particular concern to the south side of Canada Way between the Municipal Hall and Douglas Road.

In response to Alderman Brown's enquiry, the Director Engineering advised that he would look into the priority schedule with respect to the bus shelter program and advise Alderman Brown as to the plans and timing of the construction of bus shelters on the south side of Canada Way between Municipal Hall and Douglas Road.

Alderman Brown further enquired as to the reason for the existing parking signage on the north side of Hastings Street between Esmond Avenue and Boundary Road. There appears to be a duplication of signing in this area.

In response to Alderman Brown's enquiry, the Director Engineering advised that he would check into the matter and notify Alderman Brown of his findings as soon as possible.

### ALDERMAN DRUMMOND:

Alderman Drummond enquired as to the reason why our roundabouts are not similar to those in the City of Vancouver. Alderman Drummond stated that he felt that our roundabouts could be substantially improved. Alderman Drummond enquired as to whether staff had viewed the roundabouts in the City of Vancouver prior to the installation of the roundabouts on Pender Street. Alderman Drummond suggested that the banning of parking on the corners where the roundabouts are located would be a matter worth consideration.

In response to Alderman Drummond's enquiry, the Director Engineering advised that to ban the parking on the corners where roundabouts are located would encourage the traffic to speed up and swerve around the roundabouts.
