A review of the costs of recovery, based on the 1983 recast budget, shows that the municipal costs are averaging \$14.00 per bicycle.

(1) THAT effective 1984 January 01, a recovery fee of \$14.00, plus the cost of a licence, be charged to the owner of every unlicenced bicycle that is recovered by the municipality and returned to the owner.

The total cost of the work to be performed is \$536,400.00.

7. Rezoning Reference #38/83 1570 and 1580 Duthie Avenue

> The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection advising that on 1983 July 25, Council considered an application for the rezoning of 1570 and 1580 Duthie Avenue from R4 Residential District to CD Comprehensive Development District based on the RM1 and Community Plan 7 guidelines. The Planning and Building Inspection Department did not support this application as it included only a small portion of a site designated for townhouse development under the adopted Community Plan F. During consideration of the subject rezoning application by Council, the question of whether the two properties to the south, 1632 and 1636 Duthie Avenue could be incorporated into the rezoning proposal to result in a more optimal development site was raised. Council tabled the subject rezoning application on the understanding that the Planning and Building Inspection Department would report back on whether the owners of these two properties would be interested in having their properties included in a townhouse development site.

The owners of the properties known as 1632 and 1636 Duthie Avenue were contacted by the Planning and Building Inspection Department and the owners advised that they would be willing to have their properties included as part of the townhouse development site provided that a fair price could be negotiated.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- THAT Council authorize staff to meet with the applicant for Rezoning Reference #38/83 to request that he attempt to include the two properties to the south in his site assembly prior to this application being reconsidered.
- (2) THAT Council request the applicant to give consideration to withdrawing his current applications for building permits for a single family dwelling and a semi-detached dwelling on the subject properties.

8. Exemptions from Taxation

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance advising that statutorily, buildings used for purposes such as churches, schools, hospitals and other similar uses are exempt from taxation. Included with this exemption is the land on which the building stands ("footprint"). Additionally, Council is empowered to exempt land and buildings such as parking lots, playgrounds, church halls, etc., as may be determined as necessary to the principal purpose of the statutory exemption. Also available for exemption, at the discretion of Council, are properties used for various activities such as Provincially licenced community care facilities, some charitable and philanthropic organizations, athletic clubs and associations operating recreational facilities available to the public. Annually it is necessary to pass bylaws and resolutions to exempt land and improvements within the authority of Council.

The report listed the properties proposed for exemption in 1984. Apart from the adjustments resulting from changes to areas used by existing facilities, the exemptions recommended are the same as for 1983.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT bylaws be brought forward to exempt those properties listed in Sections 2 and 3 of the report from taxation in 1984.
- (2) THAT the properties listed in Section 4 of the report be exempted from taxation in 1984.

ALDERMAN BROWN:

Alderman Brown enquired as to why, at the intersection of Canada Way and Edmonds Street, there exists three covered bus shelters and yet the bus shelter on the southwest corner remains uncovered.

In response to Alderman Brown's enquiry, the Director Engineering, Mr. E.E. Olson, advised that the wooden bus shelter in question resulted from a Neighbourhood Improvement Program Project and was never covered. Mr. Olson advised that he would look into the possibility of covering this bus shelter.

ALDERMAN CONSTABLE:

Alderman Constable enquired as to the timing for the construction of street lighting on the recently constructed road known as Greystone Drive.

In response to Alderman Constable's enquiry, the Director Engineering, Mr. E.E. Olson advised that the municipality is awaiting the delivery of the steel standard poles which is expected in the very near future. Once the poles have been received then the street lighting can be put in place almost immediately.

Alderman Constable further enquired as to whether it would be possible to furnish the Vancouver City Council with information regarding Burnaby Metrotown. Alderman Constable advised that a number of the members of the Vancouver City Council appear to be unaware of the location and development of Burnaby Metrotown.
