MOVED BY ALDERMAN BROWN: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN NIKOLAI:

"THAT the delegations be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

(a) Mr. Fraser Wilson, appearing on behalf of the Burnaby Historical Society, then addressed the members of Council regarding a request for space. The following is the text of Mr. Wilson's submission:

"On 1957 July O3 a group of people from all walks of life in this large and sprawling municipality met to discuss the organization of a historical society for Burnaby.

Dr. Willard Ireland, provincial archivist and librarian, journeyed from up country to attend the meeting and give the future members the benefit of his experience along the lines of the best type of society for our needs and possible research projects.

The late Dr. Ireland pointed out that the history of Burnaby of one hundred years from now is being made today. History, he said, is being made by you and me and the man next door as well as by reeves, councilmen, judges, statesmen, policemen, pioneers, soldiers and other citizenry.

Today, we have a history of our own; some of the members of that meeting are with us tonight, after giving many years of service to preserving the history of Burnaby. But we are unhappy that after all these years we still have no place to call home. The number of times that we have been requested to change our meeting place, and remove our archives from a given storage space has almost branded us nomads in a discipline where we were our first leaders.

Attached is a letter from John Adams, a past Curator of Heritage Village, applauding the untiring work of the Burnaby Historical Society, especially regarding the preservation of the B.C. Electric interurban tram which is now one of the prime attractions at the Village.

Our Constitution encourages us to 'promote and foster historical research and public interest in history; the preservation of historic documents, relics and other significant heirlooms of the past'. Without space we often must refuse artifacts offered to us, because our members no longer have storage room in their homes. Are we to be reduced to a meetingspeaker level? We hope not.

We express our appreciaiton for Studio 2 and Studio 3, where we have met over the past few years, but ask you to now consider our need for space space to centralize our archives, and preserve the history that one hundred years from today will fall to our children. Dr. Willard Ireland imagined the best type of historical society for us, and we are asking only for the opportunity to fulfill that dream for Burnaby, a great and growing municipality."

MOVED BY ALDERMAN CONSTABLE: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN BROWN:

"THAT staff look into the possibility of the municipality providing space to the Burnaby Historical Society and report back to Council."

His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, recognized Mr. Svend J. Robinson, Member of Parliament for Burnaby, and Honourable Mrs. Eileen E. Dailly, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Burnaby North, in the audience for tonight's Council Meeting.

(b) Mr. Howard Smith, 2651 East 22nd Avenue, Vancouver, B.C., then addressed the members of Council and advised that Mr. Kennedy, who was to be the spokesman for the Trade Union Peace Committee, was unable to attend tonight's meeting due to prior commitments. However, Mr. Smith then advised that he was a delegate of the Trade Union Peace Committee and had been directed to speak tonight in place of Mr. Kennedy.

Mr. Smith then advised Council of the details surrounding the formation of the Trade Union Peace Committee which represents some thirty (30) major unions and has the endorsation of the British Columbia Federation of Labour, the Vancouver District Labour Council, the New Westminster District Labour Council and various other labour bodies, including the British Columbia and Yukon Building Trades Council. Mr. Smith advised that among their membership are thousands of Burnaby residents and what the Trade Union Peace Committee is asking is that these residents be given the right to vote on the crucial issue of disarmament. (c) Mr. Colin Snell, 6632 Kendale Court, then addressed the members of Council and advised that Mr. Richie, who was to be the spokesman for the British Columbia Provincial Council of Carpenters, was unable to attend tonight's meeting due to prior commitments. However, Mr. Snell informed Council that he was an executive board member of the British Columbia Provincial Council of Carpenters and was speaking on behalf of this association.

Mr. Snell advised that his union represents sixteen thousand (16,000) members across the province and is one of the largest unions In the province. There are approximately one thousand (1,000) members of the union or affiliated unions residing in Burnaby. At a recent convention of the British Columbia Provincial Council of Carpenters held in 1982 October several major policy positions were adopted respecting the question of world disarmament. At the convention it was decided that members of the union should appear before the various councils throughout the province and ask that the question of disarmament be placed before the electorate. In closing, Mr. Snell advised that his association is in support of the Burnaby Peace Committee's request that Burnaby hold a referendum on disarmament.

- (d) This delegation did not appear before Council at tonight's meeting.
- (e) Mr. Denis W. Ottewell, 6174 Malvern Avenue, then addressed the members of Council and advised that he was appearing as a representative of the Teachers for Peace Action Committee.

Mr. Ottewell advised that at the recent British Columbia Teachers Federation Annual General Meeting a resolution was adopted containing four basic items, being a nuclear freeze on the testing, production and employment of nuclear weapons, that there be no cruise missile testing in Canada, a pledge against first use of nuclear weapons by Canada and that Canada should pledge approximately \$7 million to efforts leading to disarmament. Mr. Ottewell, on behalf of the Teachers for Peace Action, requested that Council permit the residents of Burnaby to have an opportunity to vote on a referendum calling for general disarmament.

- (f) Mr. Robert S. Anderson, 304 North Delta Avenue, then addressed the members of Council and advised that he was a faculty member of the Department of Communication at Simon Fraser University. Mr. Anderson advised that a graduate of the Department of Communication at Simon Fraser University has completed a film entitled "If you love this planet" which dealt with the problem of nuclear arms and the film was recently awarded an Oscar. Mr. Anderson went on to advise that because of our close proximity to Bangor, Washington, our risk of suffering a nuclear attack is somewhat higher than perhaps many other communities in our country. Mr. Anderson requested that Council authorize the holding of a referendum on the question of disarmament in conjunction with the 1983 municipal election, which will provide the people of Burnaby with a democratic opportunity to carefully think about this issue and express their feelings about it.
- (g) This delegation did not appear before Council at tonight's meeting.
- (h) Dr. Donald A. Ross, 5630 Monarch Street, then addressed the members of Council and advised that he was the Chairman for the Coalition for World Disarmament, and Vice President of the association known as Physicians for Social Responsibility, B.C. Chapter.

Dr. Ross advised that there are several things that a referendum on disarmament will do. It will have an educational value; whereas most people are so preoccupied with their own situations that they do not have time to think about what is happening in the world. A referendum will give everyone a chance to think about the issue. A referendum will also supply input to those people who are going to be making the decisions regarding Canada's position on disarmament. It is for this reason that the Physians for Social Responsibility, B.C. Chapter, and the Coalition for World Disarmament support the holding of a referendum on disarmament in conjunction with the 1983 Burnaby civic election.

(i) Ms. Gayle D. Gavin, 3746 Cambridge Street, then addressed the members of Council on behalf of the Burnaby Peace Committee and requested that Council hold a plebiscite in conjunction with the Burnaby civic election to be held in 1983 November and put the following question to the residents of Burnaby:

> "Do you support the goal of general disarmament and mandate the Federal Government to negotiate and implement with other governments the balanced steps that will lead to the earliest possible achievement of this goal."

Upon concluding her presentation Ms. Gavin submitted a petition containing the signatures of 3,499 Burnaby residents. The text of the petition is contained hereunder:

"We, the undersigned, urge Burnaby Council to place the question of world nuclear disarmament on a referendum ballot in the next municipal election and join the citizens of 121 other cities and communities in Canada, including Ottawa, Toronto, Vancouver, Victoria, Nanaimo, Coquitlam and North Vancouver District."

This petition has been placed on file at the office of the Municipal Clerk.

(j) Honourable Mrs. Eileen Dailly, 6785 Napier Street, a Member of the Legislative Assembly for Burnaby North, then addressed the members of Council and advised that though she will be expressing primarily her opinions on this issue she is also representing Honourable James Lorimer, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Burnaby South and Mrs. Rosemary Brown, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Burnaby Edmonds.

Mrs. Dailly advised that the nuclear build up around the world has been so great that the prospects of an accident occuring are almost inevitable. Mrs. Dailly went on to refer to the fact that over 100 municipal councils across Canada have held referendums on disarmament and several communities have declared their area nuclear free zones.

Mrs. Dailly urged that Burnaby Council hold a referendum on the question of disarmament in conjunction with the 1983 Burnaby civic election to be held in 1983 November.

(k) Reverend Donald Grayston of 5057 Irmin Street, then addressed the members of Council on behalf of the Burnaby Christian Peace Council, and the text of Reverend Grayston's submission is contained hereunder:

"Friends and fellow-citizens--stewards of our welfare in the municipality of Burnaby:

- 1. We wish to state our full support for the proposal of the Burnaby Peace Committee that a referendum on nuclear disarmament be held in conjunction with the civic elections in the fall.
- 2. As Christians, we hold these convictions:
 - (a) the earth is God's creation, and therefore a sacred reality; it has been entrusted to the human race to love, honour and enjoy
 - (b) the earth now stands in terrible jeopardy of desecration and destruction through the increasing possibility of nuclear holocaust;
 - (c) Christians are called by their Lord, Jesus Christ, to be peacemakers (see Matthew 5.9);
 - (d) throughout the centuries, Christians have sometimes responded to this call, and sometimes have not;
 - (e) as contemporary Christians, the threat of the desecration of the earth and of the end of civilization as we have known it demands a forthright response.

- 3. But is this a municipal issue? Is it not rather a federal issue? In the report of Vancouver's City Manager to Council of 1982 November 05, the Medical Health Officer outlines the ramifications for public health (a municipal responsibility) of a nuclear attack on Vancouver:
 - (a) doctors, hospitals and public health agencies would be destroyed in a nuclear attack; no organized response is possible;
 - (b) Evacuation is impossible, inasmuch as World War III would be over within an hour.
 - (c) the medical consequences would include the following: immediate concerns (e.g. radiation, burns, injuries); short-term (radiation, infections); and long-term (radiation cancer, mutation and environmental catastrophe);
 - (d) the only viable approach to these possibilities is prevention -there is no cure.

In this connection, we note that hundreds of cities throughout the world (including Vancouver) have declared themselves to be nuclear weapons-free zones. We encourage Burnaby to do the same.

Further to this point: because municipal government is closest of all levels of the government to the people, a statement on the municipal level will contribute to the amount of influence needed to move an inert and evasive federal government to decisive action. We therefore ask for your support for the Burnaby Peace Committee's proposal."

(1) Mr. Svend J. Robinson, #109 - 8752 Centaurus Circle, Member of Parliament for Burnaby, then addressed the members of Council and advised that the issue of disarmament is an issue that cuts across all jurisdictional lines. Mr. Robinson advised that he recently circulated a questionnaire regarding disarmament to approximately 40,000 homes in the constituency and the response to the questionnaire was far greater than any response that he has received to date with respect to other questionnaires he has circulated. The question of disarmament is an issue that the people consider very important. Mr. Robinson felt that the symbolism expressed in holding a referendum on disarmament is of extreme importance. In closing, Mr. Robinson urged Council to hold a referendum on disarmament in conjunction with the 1983 Burnaby civic election.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN NIKOLAI:

"THAT the motion as moved by Alderman Constable and seconded by Alderman Drummond be amended to read:

'That we include in the 1983 Burnaby civic election a ballot asking the question:

'Do you support the goal of general disarmament and mandate the Federal Government to negotiate and implement with other governments the balanced steps that will lead to the earliest possible achievement of this goal and that the sum of \$1,200.00 representing the estimated cost of printing and publishing the necessary referendum ballot be raised by the citizens putting the petition for this referendum forward.'"

A vote was then taken on the original motion as moved by Alderman Constable and seconded by Alderman Drummond, "That we include in the 1983 civic election a ballot asking the question: 'Do you support the goal of general disarmament and mandate the Federal Government to negotiate and implement with other governments the balanced steps that will lead to the earliest possible achievement of this goal'", and same was CARRIED with Mayor Lewarne opposed.
