SUBJECT: WORK ORDERS

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Work Order Nos. 60-21-044, 60-21-045, and 60-30-047 be approved.

60-21-044

Construct water main in Big Bend Area, Marshland-Mandeville from Tillicum Street to Wiggins Street as per Contract 8316 including engineering and work by Municipal forces.

CHARGE: 1983 Capital Budget

\$ 90,000

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: This work order is required to cover the cost of construction of the Mandeville-Marshland trunk water main loop previously approved by Council. This project is shareable with the Province of British Columbia and funds have already been received by the Corporation. Work will be performed under Contract 8316 which has already been awarded. Funds are provided in the 1983 Capital Budget - Waterworks Projects.

60-21-045

Construct reservoir, water mains and appurtenances to Centennial Pavilion, Burnaby Mountain, as per Contract 8315, including engineering and work by Municipal forces.

CHARGE: 1983 Capital Budget

\$250,000

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: This work order is required to cover the cost of construction of reservoir, water main and appurtenances to replace the existing reservoir. The work is required to provide an adequate water supply for fire protection, domestic supply, and irrigation at Burnaby Mountain Centennial Pavilion. Council has previously approved of the project, the cost of which is shared with the owners of the Owl and Oarsman Restaurant. Work is to be performed under Contract 8315 which will be presented to Council in conjunction with this work order. Funds are provided in 1983 Capital Budget - Waterworks Projects.

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Construct sanitary sewer mains.
Minor unspecified projects.

CHARGE: 1983 Capital Budget

Sanitary Sewer Projects

\$ 75,000

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: This work order is raised annually from the appropriation in the Sanitary Sewer Utility Capital Budget to cover the cost of constructing miscellaneous sanitary sewer projects. Approximately \$60,000 of this year's funds will be used to construct a sewer on Gilmore Avenue between Grandview Highway and Myrtle Street to serve the properties on Grandview Highway between Gilmore Avenue and the Gilmore-Carleton Diversion. A design for this sewer was completed in 1968 and was slated for construction at that time but was shelved pending proof of more intensive need for a sanitary sewer in the area. It is felt that now is the appropriate time for construction because of infilling and difficult drainage and septic tank problems. Funds are provided in the 1983 Sanitary Sewer Budget.
