The writer further advised that the municipality of Burnaby may wish to participate as a "presenter" briefly outlining and answering questions on their activities, or as an "observer" to become familiar with the activities of others. The meeting was tenatively scheduled for early November but has now been rescheduled to Wednesday, 1983 December 07 to permit the participation of newly elected members of Council in most G.V.R.D. municipalities.

1. Traffic Safety at Cascade Heights School

The Traffic Safety Committee submitted a report in response to the appearance of Mrs. Joy Wild, Traffic Committee, Cascade Heights Parent-Teacher Council, 4719 Patterson Avenue, Burnaby, B.C., V5E 3A5 as a delegation before the Traffic Safety Committee on 1983 November 22 regarding the relocated crosswalk on Smith Avenue and Pine Street.

The Traffic Safety Committee recommended:

- (1) THAT the existing school crosswalk policy be amended such that in locations where a previously <u>marked and patrolled</u> crosswalk is relocated to within 100 metres of its original location that the pavement markings be re-established at the new location.
- (2) THAT the action of the Director Engineering in installing school crosswalk signs and no stopping anytime zones bracketing the patrolled legal crosswalk on Smith Avenue at Pine Street be endorsed.
- (3) THAT no additional traffic control devices be installed on Smith Avenue, nor any existing ones relocated, other than those noted in recommendation (b) abovementioned.
- (4) THAT Mrs. J. Wild and Mrs. J. Smith, Traffic Committee, Cascade Heights Parent Council, 4719 Patterson Avenue, Burnaby, B.C., V5G 3A5 be notified of Council's decision.
- (5) THAT the Burnaby Detachment, R.C.M.P. be directed to rigidly enforce no stopping anytime zones recently signed on Smith Avenue at Pine Street.

- (5) THAT the negotiating committee for the municipality be made up of K. Van Elk, Personnel Director acting as Chief Spokesperson, a representative of the GVRD Labour Relations Department, J.E. Fleming, Director Administrative and Community Services, and the Medical Health Officer or designate and a representative of School District 41, (for those parts of the negotiations pertaining to the period prior to 1983 December 31).
- (6) THAT the agreement reached with the BCNU be subject to the approval of the GVRD Labour Relations Bureau Directors in the normal manner for employer ratification purposes.
- (7) THAT the Minister of Health be urged to carry out the previously planned review of public health delivery systems and funding approaches in consultation with appropriate local officials, as soon as possible.
