REVISION OF SCHEDULE "A"

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. THAT Council approve the updating of Schedule "A" of Bylaw No. 7646 being the list of charge rates for the collection and disposal of commercial and industrial refuse.
2. THAT the Municipal Solicitor be instructed to prepare and bring forward the necessary Bylaw amendment.
3. THAT the new charge rates become effective when the amended Bylaw is finally adopted by Council.

REPORT:

The amendment of Schedule "A" of Bylaw No. 7646 has become necessary due to the recent increase in the cost of disposal.

In 1982 the cost for disposal at the Coquitlam landfill was \$5.12 per ton. In 1983 Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District raised the cost to \$12.00 per ton for residential refuse and \$20.00 per ton for commercial and industrial refuse.

When the decision was made to operate a transfer station at the Coquitlam landfill site we were told by Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District that the estimated price for disposal was \$25.00 per ton for all classes of waste. Before preparing the 1984 Provisional Budget we checked further with Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District and we were given an updated estimate of \$23.00 per ton.

On 1983 November 21 we received a written report from the Chief Engineer and Manager Operations Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District stating that the charge for the disposal of all types of waste at the transfer station would be \$21.50 per ton.

In addition to the increase in disposal costs we took cognizance of Council's earlier directive to maintain our charge rates at the approximate level of the "going" rates charged by the private sector.

We maintain a very satisfactory liaison with the private sector operators and our recommended rates for 1984 and theirs are approximately the same.

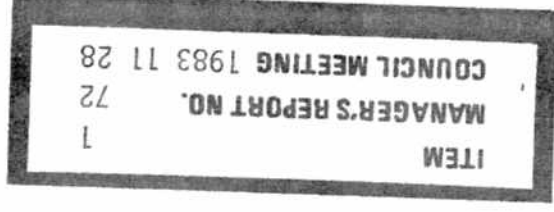
