(a) Mr. Tony Vanderheide, Director, Operating Engineers Local 115 Cooperative Association, then addressed the members of Council on the subject of the stop sign placed at the intersection of Carrigan Court and Cardston Court. The following is the text of Mr. Vanderheide's submission:

"In the early part of 1983 concerned occupants of Operating Engineers Local 115 Cooperative Association's two highrise towers at 9380 and 9390 Cardston Court expressed concern to you — in the form of a petition — over the traffic problems encountered by them at the intersection of Cardston Court and Carrigan Court.

In your regular Council Meeting dated 1983 July 11 you dealt with the following report:

'A memorandum dated 1983 May 17 was received from the Director Engineering who reported as follows:

The Engineering Department is in receipt of a petition requesting a stop sign at the intersection of Carrigan Court and Cardston Court. The subject intersection is an 'L' shaped intersection and according to our records has never had a reported accident. It is our opinion that a stop sign erected to stop traffic on either leg would receive very poor compliance from motorists and could, in fact, create an accident condition if the left turners mentioned in the petition were to presume all vehicles would stop.

In regard to the request to prohibit parking on the east side of Carrigan Court, we would point out again that there has been no accident history to justify such a restriction. Under the Burnaby Street and Traffic Bylaw vehicles are not allowed to park within 20 feet of the corner property line.

In summary, we would advise that there are no warrants for either the requested stop sign or the parking restrictions. Vehicles on a public highway wishing to make a left turn are required by law to yield to other traffic on the highway.'

Following your meeting of 1983 July 11, we received the following communication from Mr. C.A. Turpin, Deputy Municipal Clerk:

'This is to advise that Council, at the regular Council meeting held on 1983 July 11, received the attached report from the Traffic Safety Committee and adopted the following recommendations contained therein, namely:

- (a) THAT the request for a stop sign at the intersection of Carrigan Court and Cardston Court be denied.
- (b) THAT the request for a no parking restriction on the east side of Carrigan Court be denied.
- (c) THAT the petitioners be sent a copy of this report.

As directed, I am forwarding a copy of this report for your information.'

The Board of Directors of Operating Engineers Local 115 Cooperative Association has carefully examined:

- (1) your Traffic Safety Committee's report, and
- (2) the recommendations contained therein, and once again
- (3) the actual, current traffic situation.

We find serious fault with the report and for the following reasons:

- (a) We do not want to wait for an accident to happen, we want to prevent an accident from happening.
- (b) The intersection of Cardston Court and Carrigan Court can, in essence, no longer be regarded as an 'L' shaped intersection due to the amount of motor vehicles having to make a left hand turn into:

- (1) 9380 Cardston Court,
- (2) 9390 Cardston Court,
- (3) Abbey's Food Store, and
- (4) Glenrobin Apartments

Note: Approximately 400 motor vehicles are registered with our complex alone.

- (c-1) From the picture attached to the submission it can readily be detected that the view of the driver proceeding west on Cardston Court is totally obstructed when approaching the Cardston Court/Carrigan Court intersection by trees and cars on the construction site on the northeast corner of said intersection.
- (c-2) From the same picture it can further readily be detected that the view of the driver proceeding west on Cardston Court is totally obstructed when approaching the Cardston Court/Carrigan Court intersection by cars parked both 'illegally' and 'legally' on the east side of Carrigan Court in and near the Cardston Court/Carrigan Court intersection.
- (c-3) From the same picture it can finally be readily detected that the above described situations are made worse by the presence of a mailbox and several newspaper boxes which include both vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

In conclusion the Board of Directors of Operating Engineers Local 115 Cooperative Association has changed its original position on the request of a stop sign at the Cardston Court/Carrigan Court intersection, but would instead offer the following suggestions which in their opinion will greatly alleviate the current dangers to both vehicles and pedestrians:

- A. Remove the trees and other growth from the construction site on the northeast corner of the Cardston Court/Carrigan Court intersection.
- B. If a construction trailer is absolutely necessary on the northeast corner of the Cardston Court/Carrigan Court intersection, make it illegal for vehicles to park south and/or southeast of that construction trailer.
- C. Limit by yellow curb-painting, combined with appropriate traffic signs, the parking of motor vehicles on the east side of Carrigan Court for some 50 to 100 feet from the Cardston Court/Carrigan Court intersection.

Considering that our requests and suggestions amount to a very limited capital expenditure by the Burnaby Municipal Council and further considering that such limited expenditures result in the protection of lives and property of Burnaby taxpayers, we strongly appeal to you to reconsider your decisions of 1983 July 11."

(b) Union of British Columbia Municipalities, President, Re: Financial discussions on revenue sharing expectations for 1984

A memorandum dated 1983 August 22 was received from the President of the Union of British Columbia Municipalities advising that the U.B.C.M. had met with the Minister of Municipal Affairs, Honourable William Ritchie, on 1983 August 18, at the Minister's invitation. The meeting was devoted to financial discussions on revenue sharing expectations for 1984 and to what degree, if any, the Provincial Government would impose further expenditure limitations on local government. The memorandum provided details of the meeting with the Minister of Municipal Affairs and advised that the Minister will be commenting further on these matters at the U.B.C.M. Convention to be held in Penticton on 1983 September 13, 14, 15 and 16.

(c) Pacific National Exhibition, President,
Re: Miss Darcelle Chan - 1983-84 Miss Lady Fair

A letter dated 1983 August 26 was received from the President of the Pacific National Exhibition congratulating Council and the municipality upon the selection of Miss Darcelle Chan as the 1983-84 Miss Lady Fair.

(d) Province of British Columbia, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Minister, Re: Fifth installment 1983 Unconditional Grant

A letter dated 1983 August 24 was received enclosing a Province of British Columbia cheque in the amount of \$629,528.00, representing payment to the municipality of the fifth installment of the 1983 Unconditional Grant pursuant to Part VIII of the Revenue Sharing Act Regulations. This installment brings the total amount paid to date under the program to \$3,147,640.00.

(e) District of Kitimat, Municipal Manager, Re: Kitimat Council's resolution detailing position on Provincial Government's Legislative Package

A letter dated 1983 August 24 was received from the District of Kitimat enclosing a copy of Kitimat Council's resolution detailing their position on the Provincial Government's recently announced legislative package (Bills 2 through 28). The resolution was passed unanimously by Kitimat Council and the letter urged Burnaby to consider this matter, and if it was found that the viewpoints of the two Council's correspond, to endorse the resolution and forward Council's position to the Provincial Government. The aforementioned resolution of the District of Kitimat is contained hereunder:

"WHEREAS the new legislative package put forward by the B.C. Government (Bills 2-28) has such profound and controversial consequences;

AND WHEREAS there has been such a reaction to these bills from all segments of our society;

AND WHEREAS there are indications that amendments will be introduced to parts of the legislative package;

AND WHEREAS the legislative package will be defined, refined and implemented primarily by regulations;

AND WHEREAS in many cases the regulations have not been written or introduced;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Provincial Government withdraw the legislative package and place it in temporary abeyance;

AND THAT input from locally elected bodies (School Boards, Hospital Boards, Regional Districts, Municipalities, etc.) be accepted;

AND THAT this input be considered in the redrafting of the legislation and the writing of regulations;

AND THAT the revised bills de-emphasize the use of regulations to the point where government can be seen to be done by legislation rather than by regulation."

(f) Phantom Security Systems B.C. Ltd., Jordan Brown, Re: 25 Taxi Licences

A letter dated 1983 August 26 was received from Phantom Security Systems B.C. Ltd. requesting that their company be supplied with twenty-five (25) taxi licences in order to supply a service within the municipality that will provide less time loss to residents as a result of the extended service in Burnaby.

ENQUIRIES

ALDERMAN BROWN:

Alderman Brown enquired as to the possibility of conducting public meetings at Maywood School and Stride Avenue School in order to inform the public of the plans associated with the construction of the ALRT line through the municipality.

In response to Alderman Brown's enquiry, His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, advised that he has already discussed the matter of public meetings with the Municipal Manager though definite plans to hold such meetings have yet to be established.

Alderman Constable suggested that the meetings be held in conjunction with B.C. Transit in order that all people knowledgeable with the construction of the ALRT will be in attendance at such public meetings. It may be possible to share the costs with B.C. Transit which will be incurred in connection with the holding of such meetings.

ALDERMAN LAWSON:

Alderman Lawson enquired as to whether the municipality had received information on the response of the School Board to the appearance before them as a delegation of Ms. Barbara Gudmundson. Ms. Gudmundson appeared before the Burnaby School Board as a delegation on 1983 August 23.

In response to Alderman Lawson's enquiry, His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, advised that the action taken by the School Board was reported in the newspaper, however, formal notification will be obtained from the School Board and provided to Alderman Lawson and Alderman Drummond.

ALDERMAN NIKOLAI:

Alderman Nikolai requested that action be taken regarding an unsightly premise at 5137 McKee Street.

In response to Alderman Nikolai's request, His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, asked the Municipal Manager to check into this reported unsightly premise.

ALDERMAN McLEAN:

Alderman McLean advised that the New Westminster City Council has recently authorized the installation of a traffic signal at the intersection of 10th Avenue and East Columbia Street in New Westminster. This has resulted in an increase of commuter traffic along Holmes Street which was previously a quiet residential street. Alderman McLean requested that the Engineering Department, through the Traffic Safety Committee, conduct a study of the change in traffic patterns along Holmes Street and report to Council on this matter.

Alderman McLean further enquired as to the reason for the debris outside the Municipal Hall that resulted from the renovations to the Municipal Clerk's Office and the Legal and Lands Office. Alderman McLean felt that the debris has remained for a period longer than reasonably expected.

In response to Alderman McLean's enquiry, the Municipal Manager advised that the contractor has been requested to remove the debris and a further request will be issued tomorrow. Alderman McLean further enquired as to the reason for the unsightly appearance of the property on the outside of the fence surrounding Forest Lawn Cemetery. Alderman McLean felt that the growth of noxious weeds and grass has reached the stage where action by the municipality is warranted.

In response to Alderman McLean's enquiry, His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, requested the Municipal Manager to look into this matter and determine what can be done to ensure that the owners of the property return the same to an acceptable condition.

ALDERMAN STUSIAK:

Alderman Stusiak enquired as to the possibility of Council members obtaining a text of the comments of Honourable William Ritchie, Minister of Municipal Affairs respecting Municipal Planning Departments. Alderman Stusiak felt that it would be appropriate for those members of Council who are attending the U.B.C.M. Convention to be in possession of the statements made by the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

In response to Alderman Stusiak's enquiry, His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, advised that he would contact the Minister's office tomorrow and obtain a copy of the statements made by the Minister respecting Municipal Planning Departments.

ALDERMAN CONSTABLE:

Alderman Constable advised that as a result of his enquiry several weeks ago regarding vehicles which were parked in the 3800 and 3900 blocks East Hastings Street he has now noticed that the vehicles are now parking closer to the 4000 block East Hastings Street. Alderman Constable enquired as to whether the municipality can continue to take action to see that these vehicles no longer park in this area.

In response to Alderman Constable's enquiry, the Assistant Director Engineering, Works, Mr. W.C. Sinclair, advised that the R.C.M.P. are having a difficult time determining what is considered to be legal parking as opposed to illegal parking in this area. In order to rectify the situation the municipality would be required to post signs restricting parking and the signs will have to be maintained at a cost to the municipality.

Alderman Constable advised that should development take place in this area in the immediate future then the problem may be resolved, but should development not proceed then Council may have to look at the question of legalizing parking in the area or taking action respecting those who are illegally parked at this location.

ALDERMAN DRUMMOND:

Alderman Drummond advised that during a recent electrical storm several street lights discontinued to operate and the people in the area did not have the benefit of these street lights for some five or six days. The delay in getting the street lights repaired seemed to result from a conflict between B.C. Hydro and Power Authority and the private contractor engaged by the municipality to service these fixtures. Alderman Drummond enquired as to whether a process could be established which would eliminate this conflict and allow future problems to be resolved much more quickly.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN CONSTABLE:

"THAT this regular Council Meeting do now adjourn."
