Recommendation

39. Burnaby Cablevision Junior "A" Lacrosse Club \$1,000.

The above Lacrosse Club will be hosting the 1983 National Canadian Midget Lacrosse Championships from August 10th to 17th. All the games will be played in the Burnaby arenas with the exception of the opening and closing ceremonies which will be held in New Westminster to hold the capacity crowd.

Teams will be arriving from all across Canada and the age group of the 640 participating players is 15/16 years. All the organizers work on a volunteer basis and they are requesting financial assistance to host their banquet.

As this application meets the criteria of our policy and guidelines, your Committee would recommend that a grant be awarded the Burnaby Cablevision Junior "A" Lacrosse Club in the amount of \$1,000.

40. Kiwassa Neighbourhood Services Association Nil

This Association began as an Eastside Vancouver based program designed to meet the social and life skill needs of hearing-impaired children, to provide help and support to families and to educate the hearing community on the implications of deafness.

We are advised that of the fifty (50) children served in 1982, thirteen (13) were Burnaby residents, and that because this service has expanded beyond Vancouver City's boundaries, city staff are recommending cutting their grant by 50% (amounting to approximately \$10,000.).

They are therefore requesting a grant from Burnaby in the amount of \$4,900. (i.e. 26% of the "city budget") on a temporary basis until they secure a more permanent funding source. Your Committee has noted that this organization is a United Way Agency and also receives funding from the Ministry of Human Resources.

It is recommended that this application be denied.

42.	<u>Vancouver Playhouse</u>	\$5,000.

As Council is aware, an annual grant has been awarded the Vancouver Playhouse for many years.

In 1980, 1981 and 1982, they received \$5,000. each year. They are now requesting an increased grant of \$7,500.

Your Committee would recommend that \$5,000. be awarded the Vancouver Playhouse for 1983.

43.	<u>Christmas Dinner Grants</u>	\$1.50 per head.

For many years, Council has approved grants to Senior Citizens' organizations for their annual Christmas Dinners. In 1981, the amount was increased from \$1.00 to \$1.50 per member.

It is noted that in 1982, several of our senior organizations advised that because they were sensitive to the need for budget restraints, they would not be applying for their usual Christmas Dinner grant.

It should also be noted that many of these organizations have further demonstrated their understanding of the current situation by coming forward with generous donations towards the "Elderly Citizens' Bus Service" that they have earned by organizing various fund-raising activities.

Your Committee would again recommend that \$1.50 per head be awarded to Senior Citizens' organizations for their Annual Christmas Dinners during 1983.

44.	<u>United Way of the Lower Mainland, Burnaby Division</u>	\$10,000.

The services provided by the above organization to our community are well known. Since 1958, when the Burnaby Division of the United Way was established, Council has approved an annual grant. For each of the years 1980, 1981 and 1982, they received \$10,000.
