RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT this report be received for information purposes.

REPORT

At its meeting of 1984 August 07, Council received Item 12, Manager's Report No.50 on the above subject.

The report was tabled and staff was requested to provide further information relating to comparison costs for facilities in other municipalities and to the provisions in place for assisting those in need to gain access to our facilities.

To assist in setting the 1985 costs for pools and rinks, a survey was conducted of other Lower Mainland areas to determine their 1984 charges. The survey was a comprehensive one and for this reason, copies are being circulated with this agenda only to Council with the understanding that anyone else who may be interested in reviewing the content may do so by contacting the Parks and Recreation Department.

The Commission provides free admission to its facilities for many low income residents by providing tickets to a number of community agencies. In 1984, \$10,189.25 worth of tickets were provided through this program. Attachment #1 shows the breakdown of agencies receiving tickets and the value of tickets received.

In conclusion, the 1984 fee structure is in line with charges in surrounding areas and it is anticipated that the 1985 increases in those areas will be comparable to those proposed for Burnaby. An assistance program to low income Burnaby residents is provided by distribution of free tickets to community agencies. In all respects, the proposed fees are considered to be fair and reasonable, and it is staff's opinion that it would be appropriate for Council to adopt them in the manner as set out in the report that was received and tabled on 1984 August 06.
