1. THAT the Mayor and Council support in principle Canada Permanent Trust Company/Realtor's Home Protection Plan offer.


REPORT:

Canada Permanent Trust Company/Realtor is interested in establishing a Home Protection Program to reduce the incidence of breaking and entering and theft as it relates to residential property. As a public service, it is hoped that by reducing this type of crime, neighbourhoods will become safer to live and to work in and hence the improvement will be of benefit to all of us.

Through the use of small window decals, potential criminals are informed that a \$500.00 reward will be paid by Canada Permanent Trust Company/Realtor for information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone caught entering these premises illegally. This type of program has been successful in protecting public property. The Program, hopefully, will be of value in two ways; first it will act as a deterrent in some instances, and secondly, it would encourage the public to provide more information to the police.

This program has been successfully operating in Ontario for the past three years and has received the approval of all Police Departments concerned. There is little or no extra work for the detachment other than providing information to substantiate any claims.

We have examined the program and feel that the project has merit, and we have met with Canada Permanent Trust Company/Realtor's local manager, Sandy REED, to accept their offer. We are also prepared to accept similar offers from other Realtors. We are anticipating that this Home Protection Plan will add yet another dimension in our fight against crime.
