RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Council consider an alternate road system for the extension of Central Boulevard through Metrotown, leaving Bonsor Park as it presently exists.

REPORT

At its meeting of 1984 October 03 the Parks & Recreation Commission received a report from the Director Recreation & Cultural Services on the above subject. The report recommended that the Commission approve a redesign of Bonsor Park which would allow for the extension of Central Boulevard along the park southern boundary and that the Commission request that Muncipal Council place sufficient funds in the road construction program to implement the redesign.


The Commission by motion defeated these recommendations. The Commission also heard a delegation from the South Burnaby Men's Club, spokesman Mr. Richard Smith, which urged the Commission for a number of reasons to oppose the extension of Central Boulevard through Bonsor Park.

The Commission subsequently approved the following motion:
