

18. Complaint from Mrs. T. Peacock, #201, 7466 - 14th Avenue, Burnaby, B.C. V3N 1Z9 Regarding Rooster Noise Disturbance

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Chief Public Health Inspector which was written in response to a complaint received from Mrs. T. Peacock regarding noise by roosters kept in the neighbourhood.

The report advises that noise level readings taken in the vicinity were not found in violation of the Noise Bylaw. The keeping of poultry at the residential zoned property was determined by the Licence Department to be legally non-conforming. The report further advised that the owner of the poultry has been requested to voluntarily reduce the number of poultry on his property and a recent inspection confirmed that a small reduction had taken place.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(b) Mr. Ralph Heinrich, 3076 East 27th Avenue, Vancouver, then addressed the members of Council on behalf of Central Burnaby System Taxi Ltd. which proposed that the municipality approve licences to operate its fleet within the Municipality of Burnaby. The delegation briefly described the proposed service and presented documents outlining the company's preparation for operations, systems service and particulars of incorporation, copies of which are available for inspection in the office the Municipal Clerk.

The delegation suggested that a monopoly situation currently exists in the municipality with respect to taxi service and his company proposed to operate a superior 20 car fleet of luxury vehicles and obtain an option of 10 licences for handicapped-accessible vehicles.

- (c) His Worship, Mayor Lewarne, advised that Mr. Gilbert had requested a postponment of his appearance before Council until the regular meeting to be held on 1986 January 06.
- (d) Mr. Keith A. Cameron, Suite 600, 1285 W. Pender Street, Vancouver, then addressed the members of Council with respect to the Still Creek throughway. Mr. Cameron advised that his client, Crown Lumber Ltd., had hoped a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection (to be considered later during this evening's Council Meeting) would have been more definitive. The delegation was specifically concerned regarding the eventual cost of possible construction of a bridge which, in 1985 dollars, would amount to some \$540,000. The report suggested that the companies to the north of the proposed road would be responsible for the cost of cul-de-sacs and the delegation advised that his clients supported this proposal. However, the specific concern related to the cost of construction of the bridge if it was eventually deemed necessary. In other respects, the delegation advised that his client accepted and endorsed the report.

11. Possible Future Construction of Still Creek Avenue Arterial Road between Gilmore Avenue and Willingdon Avenue

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection regarding possible future construction of Still Creek Avenue arterial road between Gilmore Avenue and Willingdon Avenue. The report contains advice that construction of the curvilinear road will be started in 1986 in order to service the proposed industrial park. The report notes that at some point in the future, traffic volumes could necessitate an additional direct road along Still Creek Avenue. The report suggests a cost sharing approach with the developers of the light industrial lands to the north could be supported at the time of rezoning and the use of cul-de-sacs to the lands will provide an adequate level of vehicle access.

The report concludes that if Still Creek Avenue is required to be constructed after the lands along the north are redeveloped with cul-de-sac service, then the municipality would have to consider the road as a municipal responsibility, as an element of the collector street network.

The Advisory Finance Committee submitted a report regarding a request by the Burnaby Expo Committee for a grant in the amount of \$51,000 for its 1986 program. The report advises that analysis of the park-and-ride potential in the municipality suggests that the problem might have been overstated. The report suggests a cautious, incremental approach to dealing with the problem and that the municipality should react with the appropriate on-street parking regulations as required. The report further suggests that the municipality participate in providing extra public parking as part of a comprehensive development in the vicinity of the Metrotown ALRT station.

Further, the report discusses park-and-ride demand at the Edmonds Station and notes that there is vacant land in the vicinity where parking could be developed. It was also suggested that municipal property in the area might be attractive as an Expo park-and-ride lot, particularly if B.C. Transit and/or Expo were willing to participate in its development.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT the municipality pursue the development of multi-purpose (including park-and-ride) off-street parking in conjunction with new development in the vicinity of the Metrotown ALRT station.
- (2) THAT Council authorize staff to further review the development of short term temporary off-street surface parking to the vicinity of the Edmonds ALRT station.
- (3) THAT Council endorse the phased incremental approach to the management of on-street parking in the vicinity of ALRT stations in the municipality, as described in the Director Planning and Building Inspection's report.

All services are to be designed to Municipal standards and constructed in accordance with the Engineering Design. One of the conditions for the release of occupancy permits will be the completion of all requisite services.

- d) The installation of all electrical, telephone and cable servicing, and all other wiring underground throughout the development, and to the point of connection to the existing service where sufficient facilities are available to serve the development.
- e) The subdivision of the project site.
- f) The granting of any necessary easements.
- g) The dedication of any rights-of-way deemed requisite.
- h) The approval of the Ministry of Transportation and Highways to the rezoning application.

 - d) The satisfaction of all necessary subdivision requirements.
 - e) The granting of any necessary easements.

 - g) The approval of the Ministry of Transportation and Highways to the rezoning application.
