5. Rezoning Reference No. 74/84 Lots 8, 9, & 10, Blk. 3, D.L. 34, Pl. 1441, Lots "A" & "B", D.L. 34, Plan 12192 5674, 5692, 5706, 5710 Jersey Avenue and 3967 Kingsway

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection with respect to rezoning of properties located at 5674, 5692, 5706 and 5710 Jersey Avenue and 3967 Kingsway from Residential District (R5) and Service Commercial District (C4) to Comprehensive Development District (CD), based upon the C1 (Commercial) and RM3 (Multiple Family Residential) guidelines. The report advises that the subject development is being rezoned as part of the Metrotown Area 11 which proposes a mix of Apartment (RM3) and Commercial (C1) uses. The proposed land use is in keeping with the Area Plan and the development would support the objectives of the Metrotown concept. The office/retail building would consist of approximately 1,350 square metres (14,500 sq. ft.) together with 12 three storey townhouse apartment units with full underground parking.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

- (1) THAT a Rezoning Bylaw be prepared and advanced to First Reading on 1985 June 17, and to a Public Hearing on 1985 July 09 at 19:30 h.
- (2) THAT the following be established as prerequisites to the completion of the rezoning:
 - a) The submission of a suitable plan of development.
 - b) The deposit of sufficient monies to cover the costs of all services necessary to serve the site and the completion of a servicing agreement covering all requisite services. All services are to be designed to Municipal standards and constructed in accordance with the Engineering Design. One of the conditions for the release of occupancy permits will be the completion of all requisite services.
 - c) The installation of all electrical, telephone and cable servicing, and all other wiring underground throughout the development, and to the point of connection to the existing service where sufficient facilities are available to serve the development.
 - d) The submission of an undertaking to remove all existing improvements from the site within six months of the rezoning being effected but not prior to Third Reading of the Bylaw. In the event that existing improvements on the site are vacant and considered to be a hazard to life or property the Fire Prevention Office may issue an order to demolish such improvements and remove the resultant debris prior to Third Reading.
 - e) The consolidation of the net project site into two legal parcels.
 - f) The granting of any necessary easements or covenants.
 - g) All applicable condominium guidelines as adopted by Council shall be adhered to by the applicant.
 - h) The deposit of the applicable per unit Neighbourhood Parkland Acquisition Charge.
 - i) The deposit of the applicable charge of \$.50 per gross building square foot to go towards the acquisition of public open space in Metrotown for the office/commercial portion of the project.

- j) The undergrounding of existing overhead wiring abutting the site if this is technically feasible.
- k) Compliance with the Council adopted sound criteria.

14. Letter from Powell River Regional District, 5776 Marine Avenue, Powell River, B.C. V8A 2M4 C.E. Kelly & Associates Proposal to Transport Lower Mainland Garbage to Harwood Island

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Engineering written in response to correspondence from the Powell River Regional District regarding a proposal to transport Lower Mainland garbage to Harwood Island. The report advises that the G.V.R.D. has been approached by up to forty different organizations with proposed solutions for the problem of refuse disposal from the Lower Mainland. The G.V.R.D. had invited proposals for the disposal of 100,000 to 300,000 metric tons of Lower Mainland refuse and these will be assessed by a G.V.R.D. Sub Committee on 1985 June 27. G.V.R.D. staff had advised that one of the terms of reference with respect to the proposal call was that any disposal method, especially landfill, must have the approval of the appropriate local authority before being accepted and implemented.

The petition suggests that removal of the bus stop has caused hardship to senior citizens and urges Council to have the stop returned to its original location.

15. Bill 49 - Special Enterprise Zone and Tax Relief Act

The Municipal Manager submitted a report written in response to the memorandum received from the U.B.C.M. with respect to Bill 49 - Special Enterprise Zone and Tax Relief Act which was introduced in the Provincial Legislature on 1985 June 05. The report advised that a preliminary review of the scope and nature of Bill 49, when considered over the longer term, raises several concerns about possible future implications to the municipality. The report identifies the areas of concern and advises that a review of the legislation has been initiated by staff which will result in a report to Council on 1985 July 02.

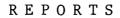

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Chief Public Health Inspector regarding environmental issues concerning the Greater Vancouver Regional District incineration plant. The report provides details of the G.V.R.D. response to environmental issues raised by the Environmental Health Department concerning the effect the refuse incineration plant will have on ambient air quality and community noise levels. The G.V.R.D. had predicted that ambient air quality will comply with existing regulatory requirements and they had assured that noise emissions will not exceed noise bylaw requirements or serve as an annoyance to surrounding residential communities. G.V.R.D. staff are currently establishing a program for ambient air monitoring of the residential communities surrounding the plant and there has been a commitment to have continuous community ambient air monitoring prior to and after startup of the refuse incineration plant.

The report advises that the subject property falls within a single or two family residential district (R5), and is not in an area proposed for alternative use. It was noted that requisite departmental approvals have been given and staff would therefore support the proposed Strata Titling, provided all requisite Guidelines for Conversion of Existing Occupied Two-Family Dwellings into Strata Title Units are fully satisfied.

The report advises that the executors of the subject property had requested that relief be given against the consolidation requirement contained in the original Transfer Document between the municipality and the property owner and it was further recommended that a new Transfer be prepared and deposited in the Land Title Office.

Bennett regarding inclusion of the motion picture industry in an industry strategy for Burnaby. The report advises that the municipality has supported the development of the film industry on part of the Dominion Bridge property and will continue to do so on a more permanent basis as part of the industrial redevelopment of these lands. The report further advises that the Partners in Enterprise program has made provision for a number of initiatives intended to assist municipal economic development. The degree to which these various initiatives can, or should, be used by the municipality is presently unclear and staff are continuing to obtain further administrative details associated with the program. If the initiatives prove to be beneficial and the associated funding formula attractive, it is intended that these will be pursued by staff, with prior approval of Council, as part of the municipality's continuing internal work programs.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

8. B.C. Transit - Impact of Funding ALRT on Burnaby Property Owners

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance regarding the impact of funding of ALRT on Burnaby property owners. The report concludes with advice that the Province, to date, has not indicated how the additional costs for local governments' share will be funded. There had been speculation that the Motive Fuel Tax or the surcharge on electrical billings could be increased, that the property tax on B.C. Transit assessments could be increased, or that a new source of funding on residential assessments could be implemented. The report suggests that without further announcements and details from the Province, any estimates at this time by Burnaby staff would be speculative.

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance regarding the sale of the Hendrickson Combination Aerial and Pumper Truck. The report advises that the District of Mission has made an offer to purchase the truck for the sum of \$51,100.00 and staff was presently in the process of finalizing the sale. Proceeds will be added to the reserve for the replacement of fire equipment.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT the report be received for information purposes.

The report indicates that fire losses during 1984 were 15 percent lower than in the previous year and advises that most of the objectives set by the Department for 1984 were achieved.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

11. Letter from Mr. L.S. Hodgkins which appeared on the Agenda for the meeting of Council for 1985 May 13 Proposed Sale of 8621 Armstrong Avenue

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Officer-In-Charge, Burnaby Detachment, R.C.M.P. written in response to a delegation which appeared before Council at its regular meeting held on 1985 May 13 regarding concerns arising from the proposed sale of municipal property at 8621 Armstrong Avenue. The delegation had expressed concerns regarding alleged illegal parking in the lane north of Armstrong Avenue and east of the Burnaby Chinese Alliance Church. Council referred the matter to staff for report.

The report advises that the matter was reviewed by the R.C.M.P. and it was recognized that a parking problem exists on weekends in the subject area. The R.C.M.P. is responding to individual complaints from the residents in the area and will continue enforcing the applicable parking bylaws where it has been established that illegal parking is evident.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT a copy of the report be sent to Mr. L.S. Hodgkins at 8639 Armstrong Avenue, Burnaby, B.C.

12. Smith Avenue to Kingsway Road Link

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Engineering regarding proposed permanent closure of the road link between Smith Avenue and Kingsway to vehicular traffic. Council had recommended that following A.L.R.T. construction, and subject to negotiating a favourable agreement for use of a portion of the B.C. Hydro right-of-way, a one way westbound Kingsway to northbound Smith Avenue connection be restored. The report advised that B.C. Transit had now designed a road link and was anxious to build and complete the project. The report advises further of an application to build a restaurant at 3845 Kingsway which, if developed, would indicate a requirement for a two way system through to Smith Avenue. The Engineering Department reiterated its concerns regarding the hazardous traffic situation, particularly during peak periods if left turns onto Kingsway from Smith Avenue were allowed.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT all vehicular accesses to the Smith Avenue connector be right turn in/right turn out only.

(2) THAT the owners of properties 3823 and 3845 Kingsway and 5710 Smith Avenue receive a copy of the report.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN BROWN:

"THAT the recommendations of the Municipal Manager be adopted."

16. Cooperative Proposal Related to Edmonds ALRT Station Retaining Wall Working Area 7445 - 19th Street

The Municipal Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building Inspection regarding a cooperative proposal related to the Edmonds ALRT station, specifically to obtain a 10 foot wide temporary working area at 7445 - 19th Street. As the municipality had already been in contact with the property owners with respect to acquisition of a right-of-way for widening of 18th Avenue, B.C. Transit had requested that municipal staff also pursue additional negotiations with the property owners for a temporary working area strip for construction of a retaining wall related to the Edmonds ALRT station.

The Municipal Manager recommended:

(1) THAT Council approve of the negotiated licence to enter upon the temporary working area over property at 7445 - 19th Street (Duron B.C. Ltd.) and the cost-sharing proposal with B.C. Transit as outlined in the report.

NEW BUSINESS

Alderman Stusiak

Alderman Stusiak handed to staff a petition from South Slope residents for inclusion in the Council Agenda of 1985 June 24. The petition protests the high noise level from Marine Way, particularly since recent resurfacing work has been carried out by the Provincial Highways Department, and urges the construction of a noise barrier or fence, similar to the one constructed along the Upper Levels Highway in West Vancouver.

ENQUIRIES

Alderman Lawson

Alderman Lawson enquired with respect to the adequacy of parking restriction signs in the vicinity of Barnet Beach following the issuance of some 40 traffic tickets during the weekend of 1985 June 08 and 09.

The Director Engineering, Mr. E.E. Olson, undertook to investigate the matter jointly with the Director Recreation and Cultural Services.

Alderman Lawson enquired of staff as to whether there was any further information regarding proposed implementation of the 911 emergency number throughout the Lower Mainland.

In response, the Municipal Manager, Mr. M.J. Shelley, advised that a committee of Lower Mainland Mayors is currently reviewing this matter and will be meeting with representatives of the B.C. Telephone Company in the near future.

Alderman Lawson referred to the illegal dumping of a toxic substance or substances, on about 1985 June 13, into the storm sewer system in the northeast Burnaby or Coquitlam area. The toxic material had subsequently drained into the Brunette River resulting in the killing of all fish life in the river system below the storm drain outfall. Alderman Lawson then noted that Federal Fisheries and Oceans Department staff were on the scene at 6:00 p.m. but municipal staff were not on site until sometime later; the method of communication between Federal and municipal staffs was therefore brought into question.

In response, the Director Administrative and Community Services, Mr. J.E. Fleming, acknowledged that there had been some delay in communication in this instance, although communication between the various levels of government was normally of a high standard. The communication delay had been reviewed and steps taken to ensure that there are no future delays.

Alderman Lawson further enquired as to whether steps could be taken to better publicize the reporting mechanisms for citizens to inform the authorities if they suspect illegal dumping of material is taking place. In discussion, the following telephone numbers were announced for citizens to report any incidents of suspected illegal dumping of substances into the storm sewer system or any watercourses:

294-7390 (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday) 294-7200 (weekends/evenings)

Alderman Lawson further suggested that steps be taken to heighten public awareness of the need to report any suspected illegal dumping of toxic or hazardous materials.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN McLEAN: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN EMMOTT:

"THAT with respect to suspected illegal dumping of toxic or hazardous materials, and in order to raise public awareness, an appropriate article be placed in 'Information Burnaby' describing the effects of toxic substances and providing telephone numbers which may be used by the public to report any suspicious activity in this regard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Alderman McLean

Alderman McLean enquired as to the availability of advice to industry and members of the public wishing to dispose of toxic or hazardous materials.

In response, the Director Engineering, Mr. E.E. Olson, advised that enquiries are normally referred to the Provincial Environment Ministry who make arrangements for disposal at a site in Oregon, U.S.A.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN McLEAN: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK:

"THAT the Greater Vancouver Regional District be requested to examine the problem of disposal of toxic and hazardous materials and to make arrangements for a central acceptance area in the G.V.R.D. for hazardous and toxic by-products of industry."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Alderman Brown

Alderman Brown enquired as to the regulations governing the movement of tractor trailers in and out of the Safeway warehouse. Alderman Brown advised of complaints from residents who have been disturbed by vehicles using the 16th Street access to Tenth Avenue between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 1:00 a.m.

The Director Engineering, Mr. E.E. Olson, advised that routing regulations and hours of operation had been changed and he, therefore, undertook to investigate the matter and report to Alderman Brown directly.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN STUSIAK: SECONDED BY ALDERMAN NIKOLAI:

"THAT this regular Council Meeting do now adjourn."
